## New Coordinator Named For 15 - Church Agency

The Rev. Rodney E. Houck, pastor of Second Presbyterian Church in Providence and chairman of the chaplaincy department of the Rhode Island Council of Churches, has been appointed coordinator of the Southeast Ecumenical Ministry (SEM).

He is a graduate of Muhlenberg College in Allentown, Pa., and of Union Seminary in New York. His wife, Joan, is president of Rhode Island's Church Women United. They have four children.

SEM is a cooperative endeavor of 15 churches with offices at Blessed Sacrament. It sponsors or participates in such programs as Friends in Service Here (FISH), the Park Avenue Project, Southeast Community Center, Southeast Nutrition Center and Monroe Center for Community Life. The Rev. Jay Leshner, pastor of New Life Community Church, has served as interim coordinator since last January.

## Greek Community Offers Festival

A sculpture commissioned by Rochester's Greek community as a gift to all the people of this area will be unveiled by the artist Sunday afternoon, Oct. 31, during a festival in Midtown Plaza.

The gala will highlight Greek Week, which begins today in the mall. It will be preceded by a commemorative liturgy at 10 a.m. in the Church of the Annunciation.

Sunday is designated Ochi Day, in reference to the "No!" (ochi) that was the Greek people's response to the Axis powers in 1940. Everyone is invited to the Greek Orthodox church, at 962 East Ave.

Constantine Seferlis, resident sculptor at the National Cathedral in Washington, will unveil a cast of his bust of Solon, the Athenian statesman whose name has come into the English language as a

synonym for "wise lawgiver." The finished bronze will be placed at a later date in the Hall of Justice, through the efforts of the Flower City Chapter of AHEPA (American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association.)

The Sunday celebration, which begins at 2:30 p.m. and continues until midnight, includes a forum on Cyprus, a banquet of traditional foods and wines and a "taverna" evening, with Gus Vail and his orchestra. Admission to this is by \$20 ticket, and reservations may be made evenings with Dennis or Dorothy Livadas, 244-0472.

The open part of Greek Week in Midtown Mall includes an exhibit of 28 panels depicting the Hellenic contribution to the world, folk dancing and music and displays of cultural interest.
