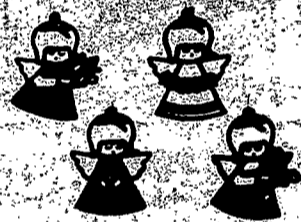
Class of '26 Sets Reunion

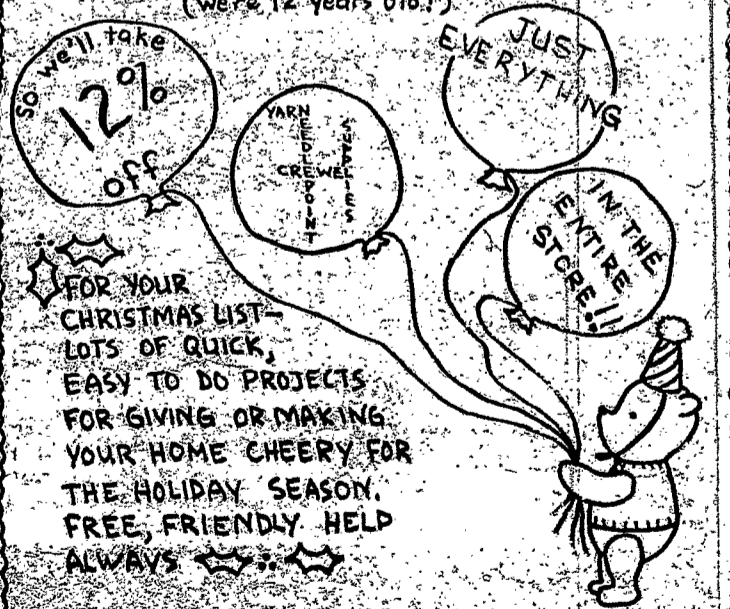

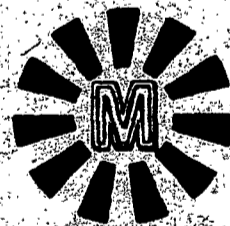
