

Sister Gaye Moorhead Pronounces Final Vows

"Walk while you have the light" was the theme chosen by Sister Gaye Moorhead when she made her final profession of vows in the Congregation of the Sisters of Mercy on Oct. 23 at the Mercy Motherhouse, Blossom Road.

She pronounced her vows during the Eucharistic liturgy celebrated by Father Bernard Dollen, pastor of St. Andrew's Church. Father Dollen also was the homilist.

Concelebrant was Father Winfried Kellner, assistant pastor at St. Andrew's. Deacon John Firpo

assisted. St. Andrew's Folk Group led the singing.

Sister Gaye founded Andrew Center, a licensed foster care home in 1973. The home is situated in half of St. Andrew's Convent, 81 Barberry Ter., and presently accommodates eight sisters and up to six foster children referred by the Montoe County Department of Social Services and in need of immediate placement.

Sister Gaye entered the Sisters of Mercy in 1971 and made her first temporary commitment in 1973.

She graduated from the U.S.A.F. Academy High School in Colorado Springs, Col., in 1966 and received her B.A. in English and Secondary Education from SUNY at Geneseo in 1972.

Her parents are Mr. and Mrs. Rex Moorhead of Livonia, Mich.

Before and after entering the Mercy Congregation, Sister Gaye has served in various areas of social need, including Perkinsville, as a Vista volunteer with migrant workers; the Rotary Sunshine Camp; and the Newark State School.

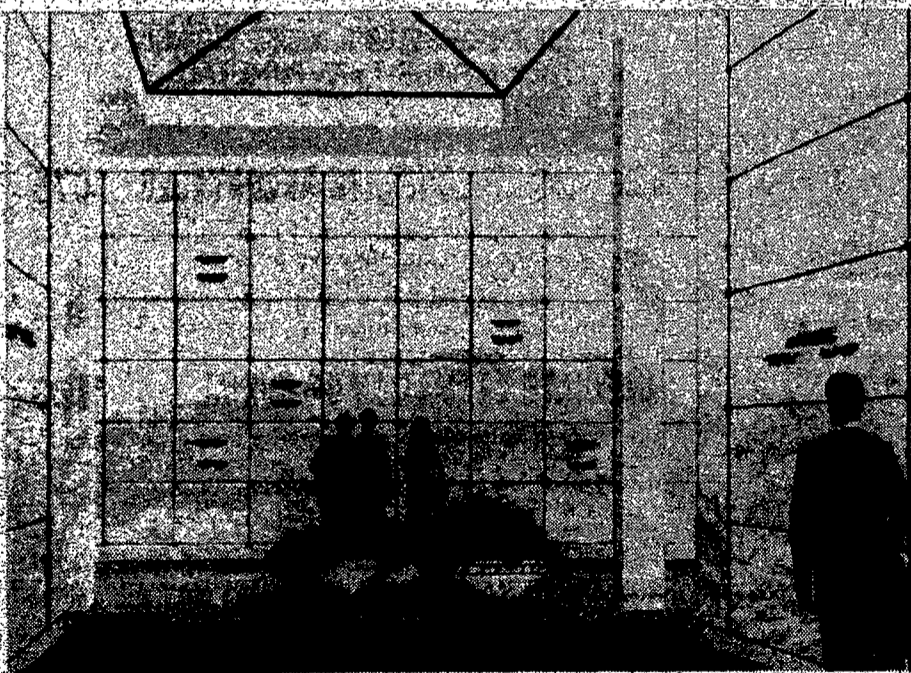
