



Finally a few years ago, an artistic Madonna and Child was printed and offered at Christmas. The anti-religion people raised so violent an objection that the Postal Department did not print a religious stamp the following year. Evidently some one got to headquarters, because there has been a Madonna and Child stamp each year ever since.


