


Aquinas Institute

The greatest thing Cardinal Mooney has going for it is its students. Mooney students are the greatest; they have a unique spirit that makes going to high school a lot of fun. Whether at a football, basketball, baseball, girls' field hockey game, or any athletic event, at a school dance, a roller skating party, at drama rehearsals or at the Annual Paper Drive, Mooney kids have a lot of fun just being with each other.

The co-educational school is staffed by Brothers of Holy Cross, Sisters of Mercy and many dedicated lay men and women. A big school, it provides all kinds of academic opportunities and social occasions.

Learning and education take on many different dimensions at Mooney. The religious dimension is a core value. Mass is offered daily in the school oratory and prayer is an integral part of the school day, since we recognize our needs and dependence upon our Creator.

The school offers a College Regents and local preparatory program, as well as a full major in careers learning. The course offerings at Mooney are extensive and up-to-date, as is its flexible rotating schedule that gives variety, as well as structure to every school day. College credit courses in Math, English and Spanish are open to Seniors who select this option. Honors Courses in English, Social Studies and Math, as well as Advanced Placement, are available.

Career programs offer a full major in Business — general office and secretarial majors — as well as a full major in Career Mathematics. Two reading specialists conduct reading labs for under-achievers.

Art offerings include Drawing and Painting, Sculpture, Print-making, Ceramics and Advertising Design, Mechanical Drawing and selective courses in Ceramics Studio and Crafts.

Cardinal Mooney is distinguished by its Concert Band, Chorus and three years of Music Theory are available.

Physical Education activities include: bowling, tennis, archery, tumbling, side horse, parallel and horizontal bars, Swedish vaulting, square dance, wrestling, track, softball, weight training, isometrics, folk and social dance, horse shoes, golf, badminton, table tennis and field hockey. The guidance program offers personal, career and college placement counseling.

The program at Cardinal Mooney High School is aimed at developing excellence in every phase of human activity — an integrated ministry of Message, Fellowship and Service.



NAZARETH ACADEMY

Nazareth Academy is a Catholic high school for girls which offers a wide variety of educational programs to meet the needs of students with a wide range of academic abilities. Remedial classes, non-regents courses, college-preparatory studies and advanced placement offerings give each student the opportunity and challenge to develop her potential as fully as she can. Academic offerings include over 100 courses, 79 electives and 7 majors: Art, Business, Home Economics, Languages, Math, Music and Science. Individualized learning, some team teaching, flexible scheduling, independent study and tutoring for non-English speaking students enhance the educational program.

Nazareth Academy's student body represents a rich diversity of multi-ethnic backgrounds. The school population is 67 per cent urban, 19 per cent inner city and 14 per cent suburban. A foreign language is spoken in 15 per cent of the students' homes. Current enrollment is 760.

Nazareth Academy, founded in 1871, is owned and operated by the Sisters of St. Joseph. The school combines valued traditions with contemporary approaches to offer a quality Christian education long respected in the Rochester community. Nazareth Academy maintains accreditation by the New York State Board of Regents and by the Middle States Association.

Academic, career and personal counseling is provided by three full-time guidance counselors. The services of a school psychologist, school social worker and a speech and hearing specialist are available to all students. Students become involved in community service through theology and social science classes, Junior Achievement and the Monroe County Youth Advisory Board. Twenty-three extra-curricular organizations offer students opportunities to participate in school-related activities.

A spirit of concern for each other characterizes both the students and faculty of Nazareth Academy. Freshman Natalie Kujala, who came to Nazareth and lives here because of her family's devotion to the school, says, "I love Nazareth because of the people who care about me."
