Bishop Kearney High School is a co-institutional school, the only one in the diocese. It integrates the best in the tradition of educating boys and girls separately with the advantages that belong to co-education. It is a comprehensive school conducted by the Congregation of Christian Brothers, the School Sisters of Notre Dame, and dedicated Christian teachers.

Students are placed either in Honors or academic classes, on the basis of ability and achievement. Besides required courses, electives are offered to both boys, and girls in Business, Art., Home Economics, English, Math, Mechanical Drawing, Vocal and Instrumental Music, and Social Studies. In addition to the Advanced Placement courses sponsored by the College Entrance. Examination. Board in English, American History, and Mathematics, a college credit program with St. John Fisher and Nazareth College helps ambitious seniors to finish college in three years.

The distinctive character of Bishop Kearney is obvious in the many student activities — over 60. Boys and girls pool their talents and devote their time and energy to school and community projects. Since BK is one school, there is one liturgy, one band, one newspaper, one yearbook, one forensic group, one singing group, and so on through the many activities sponsored. One group STP — Seniors Touching People — reaches out in service to the needy of the community, the elderly, the handicapped, the underprivileged. The internationally known band includes Concert Band, Marching, Band, Pit Band, and Stage Band, Color Guard, and Twirlers Kearney Singers have contributed their time and talent to many local programs. Dramatic productions, such as last year's "Jesus Christ, Superstar" draw large audiences.

The school has a well-balanced Physical Education program and a strong intramural program, and is represented by both boys and girls in many inter-scholastic sports: basketball golf, track, softball, soccer, and tennis Boys also participate in baseball, football, hockey, and wrestling

Of the 1,940 students in the school 35 per cent are from the City of Rochester, 51 per cent from Irondequoit, and 13 per cent from the Webster-Penfield area.



Notre Dame High School

Note Dame High School is an integral part of the education mission of the Church, and it has a unique role in Christian education in the Southern Tier of the Rochester Diocese. Notre Dame provides the best possible opportunity to realize the threefold purpose of Christian education; the proclamation of the Word, the development of community and the service of mankind.

Through its program of studies, Notre Dame desires to impart religious truths and values and inspire a strong response to the Christian life. Notre Dame supports programs which offer service to the Church and the general community in Chemung County. This program began in the fall of 1974 and gives seniors an opportunity for work experience in the field they wish to pursue as a lifelong vocation. A program of visiting industry has been initiated this year. Notre Dame faculty members are learning about the application of education to work in this creative venture spensored by the Community Career Education Council.

Notre Dame has an excellent sports program and is proud of its achievement in the Sullivan Trail Conference. The record for the 1975-76 school-year-will go down in the annals of N.D. sports history as one of the greatest ever. A Bi-State Championship was achieved in the girls varsity basketball as well as in varsity football, varsity basketball, tennis and track with many fine records shown by the golf, cross-country, bewling, wrestling and baseball teams.

The school community at Notre Dame has a special relationship with the parents whose role in Christian formation is complemented and reinforced by the school. The Board of Governors, the Parents Association and the Athletic Association are parent groups which have a vital part to play in the Notre Dame story.

Notre Dame provides excellence in education and offers a healthy competition to the public schools in the area. Its presence guarantees freedom of choice, a value deeply rooted in the American tradition.
