## Runner Aims for College

Bob Hanss, 17-year-old Bishop Kearney High senior, hopes his running will help him get into Cornell, Dartmouth or Syracuse.

If his recent record City-Catholic individual cross-country championship performance or his third place finish in the Section 5 test at Alfred-Almond won't help, perhaps his fifth place academic finish among 250 seniors at Kearney will help.

Hanss helped BK and Coach Fred Kaufman to a second place finish this season behind McQuaid; the Kings finished 6-1 in the C-C circuit's big school division. McQuaid was 7-0 — the only club to defeat Kearney.

Hanss fared better than BK as a whole — he didn't lose a single league run, including Kearney's match against McQuaid.

Coach Bob Bradley's Knights clipped the Kings 25-30 when they collided on in a battle of unbeaten this season.

Hanss' winning time for the 2.9 mile Cobbs Hill course against McQuaid was 15:18, his time in the City-Catholic League title meet was 15:12 which set a new league course record.

Hanss, Rush-Henrietta Sperry's Jerry McQueen and Greece Arcadia's Jim Coddington ran in Saturday's state intersectional run at Bear Mountain State Park near West Point.

McQueen won the Section 5 run with a 14:19 clocking and Hanss finished third, 23 seconds behind

McQueen and 10 seconds behind Coddington.

His sectional run against McQueen and Coddington marked the first time he ever ran against them — although he knew as much about them as anyone from the newspapers.

Kearney finished third in the sectionals behind champion Greece Arcadia and runnerup R-H Sperry.

Hanss, who also runs indoor and spring track in the mile and two mile events for Kearney, missed the school mile mark last year by a mere half-second (4:27.5).

He hopes to break the mile and possibly the two mile BK marks this spring.

He had hopes of finishing among the Top 20 in Saturday's state meet, a considerable improvement over the 73rd place finish (among 150 runners) he recorded last year.

His cross country career at BK started in his sophomore year.

"I played basketball in grammar school (St. John the Evangelist) and went out for freshman football (at Kearney).

"I didn't play too much football, I felt I had to do something and I knew I wasn't going to go anyplace in football.

"The only other sport in the fall was cross country so I went out for it," Hanss explains.

He has hopes of even landing a possible athletic scholarship based on his cross country achievements.

He was at Cornell University last week and visited with track coach Mike Muska. He's also been contacted by other schools including Dartmouth and Syracuse.

If he's leaning anywhere, it's in Cornell's direction because he's interested in engineering.

Hanss is always running — he puts in about eight miles each day he says.

He lives near Ellison Park and often runs familiar routes through the park's hills and trails. He also runs over to Oak Hill Country Club and back, a distance of about seven miles.

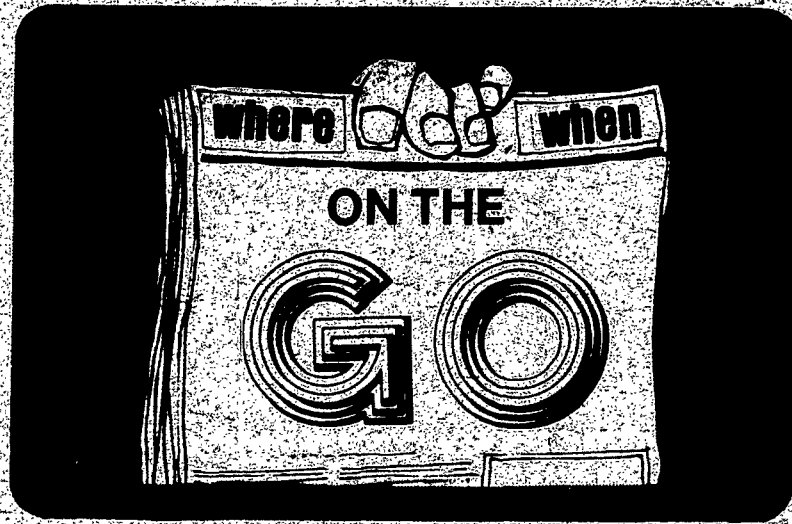
He figures he ran 440 miles last summer to stay in shape for this season.

Kearney has been the bridesmaid of sorts for the past three seasons in the City-Catholic Track League. The Kings either finish behind champion Aquinas or McQuaid, or both.

This year he figures the Kings have a shot at displacing both and bringing home the C-C track trophy to their Kings Highway trophy case.

He's also done well in the invitationals this year — he won the McQuaid Invitational in Class AAA-2 ("second best"), finished second in the Baldwinsville Invitational ("the fastest race"), eighth in the Marist College Invitational (Poughkeepsie, N.Y.) ("against the best teams and runners in the state"), and fourth in the Water-town Invitational.

He intends to keep right on running — all the way to college — and we suspect he and the final university of his choice won't be disappointed.

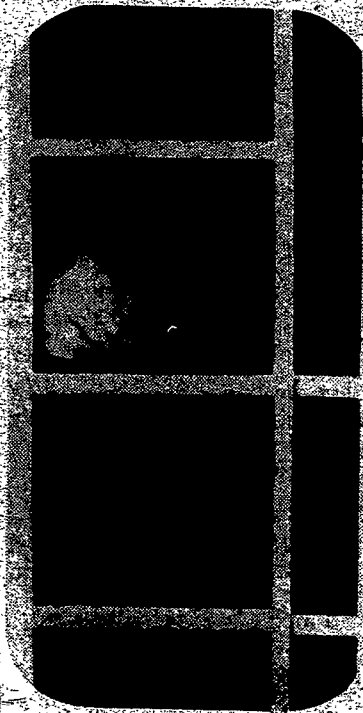
