There's a football resurgence taking place at Bishop Kearney High School and it's caught on even at the JV level!

This year's Kings won six and lost three at the varsity level and the BK JVs did even better — they were 8-1 under Coaches Brian Chadwick and Mike Nally.

Kearney's only JV loss came at the hands of Cardinal Mooney in the second game of the year — and it's obvious that Chadwick and Nally feel the result would be different if the two teams had met a second time.

In fact Chadwick says McQuaid beat Mooney later in the season and his Kings defeated McQuaid.

Chadwick, in his eighth year of coaching at BK, has guided or co-guided the Kings' JV grid fortunes for the past three years.

Last year the Little Kings were 6-3, and they were 4-3 the year before.

At the varsity level the Kings have experienced a few recent "down" years, but this year's team bore the fruit of Chadwick's and Nally's tutoring of the previous year or two.

The varsity was 6-3 and its strongest point was its defense. This year we had five of our ex-JV

players playing at the varsity level. They were able to step right in and help," Chadwick explains.

When JV kids graduate and do well in varsity, this naturally juniors and seniors.

"At the JV level they develop self-confidence and when they do get on the varsity level they're not timid or shy about playing with juniors and seniors.

"They are juniors, of course, but a lot of kids when they come out for a varsity team are a little timid."

There are freshman teams behind the JVs — a Blue squad and a White squad.

"They split the turnout equally at the beginning of the year in order to let more boys play, hoping a larger group will report later for the junior varsity and varsity," Chadwick says.

The Blues were 1-4-1 and the Whites were 2-4 this season.

"More kids get more game time with the two freshman teams and it's really beneficial," Chadwick says.

Starting quarterback was David Kausch; Jim Rice held down the fullback spot; and Paul Guadagnino and John Gaskin were the halfbacks.

The forward wall included tackles Jim Clancy and Paul Haas;

guards Mike Ryan and Joe Kolb, ends Brian Bardell and Jim Paccentini.

"That basically was the bread and butter of both our offense and defense," Chadwick says.

Guadagnino scored at least one touchdown per game either by running or hauling in a pass.

"In fact in some of the games Guadagnino threw the winning pass or scored the winning run," according to Chadwick.

Chadwick says if he had to name the backbone of the team, it would easily be Guadagnino.

Kearney trailed in every game but one, but managed to pull out the wins on all occasions except one.

Others who saw action included halfback Mike Mahoney, defensive end Joey Alvarez, defensive halfback Doug Calari and defensive tackle Brett Costello.

The BK varsity lost to McQuaid, Irondequoit and Aquinas; the JVs defeated McQuaid, Irondequoit, Aquinas and lost to Mooney.

Chadwick can't make predictions for next year based on what the BK freshman teams did this season.

Last year both freshman teams were 5-0, Chadwick says, and this year five JV starters came out for football for the first time ever!
