The Bishop Kearney Jazz Ensemble, under the direction of Raymond J. Shahin, will perform a clinic-concert for the state-convention of the New York State School Music Association on Nov. 29 at the Concord Hotel in Monticello, N.Y. The 22 member band was chosen by the state committee to be the only high school jazz group at the convention. They will present an hour and a half concert featuring a variety of jazz favorites ranging from Maynard Ferguson's "Gospel John" to Stan Kenton's "My Funny Valentine." The group's guest soloist will be Jim Peterczek, a professor of percussion at Potsdam State University College who has drummed for such performers as Glen Campbell, Liza Minelli and Tom Jones.
