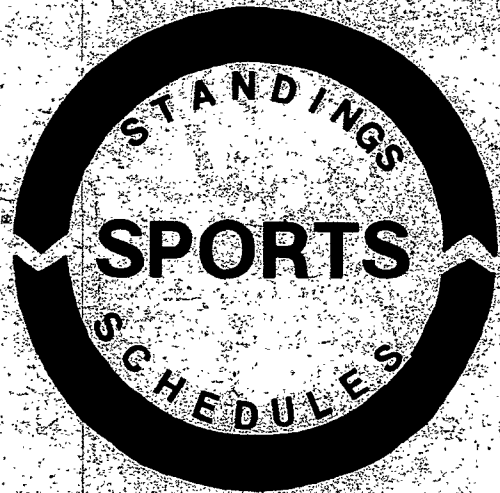

Newspaper Back in Business

It is a difficult task putting together a newspaper. A tougher one yet, when the paper has not been in existence for a time.

That was the situation which faced the DeSales senior class when they decided to renew the school paper, "Blaze-Off" which had been out of circulation for a few years. Chris Lavin and Louis Ventura took on the job as co-editors and after organizing, motivating, and meeting deadlines were proud to see the first issue published the week of Nov. 8.

General student attitude about resurrecting the paper was one of "if and when." But, according to Louis, the morning the edition hit the halls everyone was walking around with their "noses stuck in the pages."

Both editors agreed the paper's successful re-entry into school life was the result of a total effort by the staff. Besides Mrs. Nancy Boudier, moderator, and Spanish teacher George Abbot who handled the photography, more than 30 students shared the work. This number included the typists who kept the Office Practice Room hopping as they prepared copy.

Editorial, sports, news, and feature editors all helped set up the paper, spending one whole morning getting it ready for the presses. Mike Murphy had the job of assigning staff members to cover certain areas so the paper's format would encompass all aspects of the school and its students.

The first issue contained the desired variety with its freshmen interviews, class and organizational officers' list, editorials, information on up-coming school events, a word game, and sports pages.

Chris claimed there would be four issues, depending on the budget, with the June edition subsidized by the senior class.

Their duties of editorship gave Chris and Louis a busy fall season. Since Louis played on the DeSales football squad, Chris had the bulk

of the responsibility for the first issue. He is an old hand at newspaper business as he has a job with the Geneva Times. As a member of the basketball team, however, Chris' busy time is coming, so Louis will be overseeing the next edition.

Louis is a junior Rotarian and is looking forward to a career in

business. Both boys are members of the National Honor Society.

After the anxieties of producing the Blaze-Off's first 1976 issue and seeing the results, the editors are satisfied. Chris summed up the benefits of the school paper. "It offers the students a public service and it gives them a look at journalism."

JA Ready to Operate

Harris H. Rusitzky, president, Junior Achievement of Rochester and president, Serv-Rite Food Service & Consulting Corp., has announced that 53 Junior Achievement Companies have received their charters to operate.

The 53 companies are composed of 1338 students from 40 Monroe County high schools. Twelve of the companies will be meeting at the Hoover Drive School, nine at Eastridge High School, seven at the Pittsford Recreation Center, eight at the RIT Metropolitan Center, six at James Sperry High School, and three at the Schroeder High School in Webster. In addition, JA has four companies meeting in Wayne County, two in Newark and two in Palmyra, one in Churchville Chili High School, one in Brockport High

School, one in Penn Yan, Yates County and one at Radio Station WBBF.

The Junior Achievement companies have now completed their stock sales, each selling 200 shares at a \$1 each. Products have been selected and production started. Each company has elected their company officers. Each company is counseled by an area firm. Three adult advisers are working with every Junior Achievement company.

Rusitzky said that the 49 member Junior Achievement Board of Directors goal is to provide the funds and facilities to give every area student the opportunity to become a member of Junior Achievement.
