Please explain the logic incondemning divorced persons Why, when they need spiritual support, does the church deny aid? at least those who are in positions of leadership in the church are not taking a negative attitude toward these people nor are they writing them off. One of the thrusts of the movement is the effort to eliminate he idea of excommunication from the church because of divorce and remarriage.

The rationale behind the ex-clusion of divorced and remarried Catholics from the sacraments is based on the idea that the original marriage was very definitely one atified by God and therefore indissolvable: Under that assumption the marriage would last forever and the second marriage would not be a marriage at all but merely a state of living in adultery

However, that is a terrible oversimplification, especially in view of the fact that it is by no means easy to determine which marriages are ratified by God and therefore cannot be torn asunder. Much of the work of the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal has to do with making decisions about the reality of marriages in the eyes of God.

Even under these circumstances it is not always possible for human beings to make that decision Therefore it is judgmental and condemnatory that we should shun people who are in this particular situation. We have no way of knowing their status in the eyes of God; therefore we have no right to put them aside as though they werejunk.
