

Justice-Peace, Urban Schools Discussed

DPC Sets Special Meeting on 'Call to Action'

Canandaigua—Father Jerome Robinson, a delegate to the Detroit "Call to Action" conference, told the Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) that the conference is "a chance for renewal—further renewal—and Lord know's we need it," at their meeting Saturday.

He chided those who would debate the delegate selection, noting that the resolutions from the conference are "where the focus is."

"The DPC," Father Robinson said, "must make certain that the process of Detroit won't be dismissed." The DPC is a ministry, he told the delegates, and many persons in the diocese

"feel alienated" and "abandoned." Father Robinson, director of the Office of Black Ministries, emphasized that "we must be certain that we are the ones disposed to listening."

The delegates unanimously approved a special meeting for April 16 for DPC discussion of the resolutions.

Dr. Evelio Perez-Albuerne, convenor of the Peace and Justice Commission, reported that the commission will probably beat the 6 month goal for establishment. He provided the DPC delegates with a written report to date on the commission; and described the qualifications of the members and the commission's tentative work areas. Andrew Molloy

questioned the inclusion of southern Africa when other areas were excluded. Dr. Perez explained that one of the goals of the commission is to bring the problems of world justice and peace to a manageable level, and the problems in southern Africa had been selected because of the possibility of armed conflict.

Sister Boniface Roeger, DPC member and a participant in the Urban School Task Force, fielded questions concerning the task force's work and the written report supplied to members. DPC members were asked to make suggestions in writing to William Brown, task force chairperson, at the Pastoral Office.

The draft directions for

the DPC, presented and tabled at the November meeting, were brought to a vote and approved after the addition of a ninth subject, Catholic school education. The other eight are: parish spiritual renewal, selection of bishops, Detroit follow-up, divorced and separated, human life questions, role of women in the Church, urban ministry, and the permanent diaconate.

Thomas Costello and Glenna Wickline presented a proposal from the Worship and Life Committee, seeking input from other DPC members. The proposal calls for the assignment of qualified liturgy directors in each region by the Pastoral Office and Liturgy Office. Bishop Hogan noted the importance of liturgy, and said he was "enthused

about the proposal." Questions were raised concerning duplication, and the lessening of responsibility on the regional level for the selection. The willingness of pastors to cooperate with a liturgy coordinator was also questioned, and a motion

was approved asking Father Louis Hohman to discuss the proposal at the Priests Council.

Two additional meeting dates were approved, a DPC retreat at Becket Hall Feb. 25-26, and the Call to Action follow-up meeting April 16.

Air Force Academy Nominee Announced

Roger M. Smith has been announced as a nominee for the Air Force Academy by Congressman Frank Horton's office.

Smith, a graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School, is presently attending Holy Cross University.

The next step will be an evaluation of the nominees by the Air Force Academy Admissions Board. Academic record, leadership potential, aptitudes, physical fitness and extracurricular activities are all considered. Two Congressional appointees

will be selected.

According to Horton, "Those nominees not receiving my principal appointments are, if qualified, rated numerically according to their scores as alternates. Files of all qualified Congressional alternates are then evaluated on a national basis for appointment."

The Air Force Academy admits several hundred qualified alternates each year. Thus, others nominated by Horton could receive appointments to the academy as qualified alternates.
