Put Poor's Needs First, NYSCC Says

Albany— Gov. Hugh Carey and each member of the new Legislature have been told that "Human needs and human services" deserve the top priority in any rearranging of the state budget. The New York State Catholic Committee (NYSCC) has written letters to Gov. Carey and the legislators stating that "The disadvantaged, the young, the elderly, the infirm and the poor" should not be left

victim to the "battle of the budget."

The NYSCC said that it recognized there is a true "crisis in state and local finances" yet any budget cuts would affect adversely "the most vulnerable members of our society."

The letters ask for the legislators to emphasize both stimulating the economy and employment and for maintaining the standards of support for the needy now in effect.

The NYSCC letter points out that the present law provides support based on 1971 living costs. "Since May 1971," the letter, signed by Charles J. Tobin Jr., secretary of the NYSCC, points out that food costs have risen 55 per cent, gas and electricity 112 per cent, and clothing 24 per cent, while "welfare payments have not risen."
