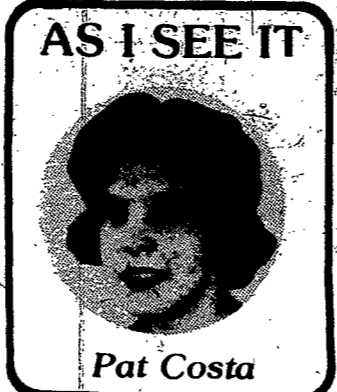

Cable subscribers who deplore the R and X rated movies which Home Box Office deals in, but like certain other features screened by the New York-based service, may find they can get everything they want closer to home — and without paying the \$8 monthly fee.

Channel 21 this month will begin the 22-part story of "The Pallisers" which to this viewer's way of thinking is the best thing HBP has offered in the past 14 months since we've been subscribers.

"The Pallisers" is the figment of Anthony Trollope's imagination and chronicles the fortunes of a Victorian political family with verve, spice and class.

Susan Hampshire plays the vivacious Lady Glencora and Philip Latham her too well-bred husband.

The series will be screened Mondays at 9 p.m., starting Jan. 31, and repeated the following Saturdays at 4. Each episode runs for an hour with the exception of the initial show which runs an extra half-hour. The Saturday show for the first episode will begin at 3:30 p.m.
