at the second Vatican Council, a mitre bearing the figure of St. John Fisher and many ceremonial texts, vestments, photographs and other memorabilia.


On the occasion of the bishop's death, St. John Fisher college, which was the recipient of many of these items, has mounted an exhibit to display a good portion of its collection.

Visitors to the college's Lavery Library may see the certificate the young James Kearney received from Columbia Teacher's Training School, a hat worn


"It represents another whole era," he said.

The library is open from 8:30 a.m. to 11 p.m. on weekdays, and from 2 p.m. to 11 p.m. on weekends.




The central exhibit is this table bearing red vestments worn by Bishop Kearney. Also here is a candlestick, a ewer and plate, a hat and several ceremonial texts.


Overlooking the collection is this statue of St. John Fisher.
