Family Center Offers Seniors Housing Help

A new program at the Catholic Family Center is the Senior Citizens' Housing Service sponsored by the Monroe County Office for the Aging. Help is available to elderly people who wish to sell their homes or apply for home improvement loans; who need subsidized housing or moving assistance, or who need a place where they can remain independent.

The service will keep a list of apartments available in private and public housing. "It is anticipated, the CFC announcement says, "that apartments in private homes will be especially useful for elderly wishing to remain in neighborhoods where they have roots." Alcoholism Workshop Set

Corning — The Corning Area Council on Alcoholism will present an Awareness Workshop for community youth Thursdays from Feb. 3 to March 31. The workshop, open to any student in grades 9-12, will be in the audio visual room at Corning Catholic School South at 7:30 p.m. each night.

The workshop will be supervised by Jessie M. Dee, executive director of the Alcoholism Council, using council staff and others from the community to present the sessions.

Subjects to be covered include: alcohol and alcoholism; alcohol and the law, by Terrance Davies of the Corning Police Dept.; Alcoholics Anonymous, Alanon and Alateen, and services of other community agencies. A trip to an open Alcoholics Anonymous meeting will be included in the workshop.
