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## NCD in Final Draft

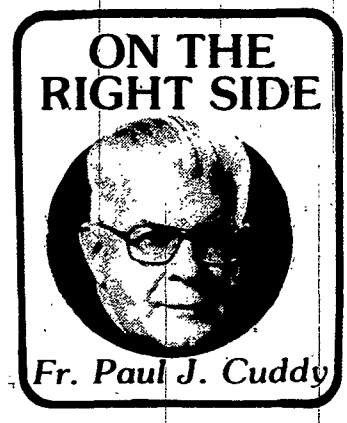
After years of consultation, revising and rewriting, the National Catechetical Directory (NCD) is now in its final phase of preparation.

Buffalo Rd., Rochester, N.Y. 14624.  
The directory, in its preamble, is intended to become "a pastoral and practical document containing norms and guidelines for teaching religion to all U.S. Catholics of all ages and circumstances."

According to Daniel McNamara of the diocesan Department of Religious Education, the writing of the final draft is now underway, and persons interested in contributing to the text should make their views known by March 15.

McNamara noted that the final text of the NCD will be presented to the nation's bishops at their November meeting. They will approve or disapprove of it; and if approval is forthcoming, they will, in turn, present the document to the proper authorities in Rome.
