Mass. Bishops Oppose Legal 'Living Wills'

Boston—The Catholic Bishops of Massachusetts expressed strong opposition to proposed state legislation advocating the "living will" because it attempts to give a "simpler answer to a very complex problem."

In testimony before a joint legislative committee of the Massachusetts legislature considering two bills, the bishops stressed that their opposition is not to the thrust of the measure — that a person be allowed to die if he or she chooses not to take advantage of extraordinary means of life support. They said:

"We are convinced that the proper response cannot be given through a legislative enactment but only within the basic parameters of the patient-doctor relationship. We assert that it would be an egregious error to seek the resolution of this question by means of a legal document."

The statement was presented on behalf of the Massachusetts Catholic Conference (MCC) by Auxiliary Bishop Timothy Harrington of Worcester during a public hearing at the Massachusetts state house here. The MCC represents the four Catholic dioceses of the state, Boston, Worcester, Fall River and Springfield.

Emphasizing that the bishops do not quarrel with "the sense of compassion and concern" of the bills' proponents, the statement said "we believe that the process of dying should not be unusually prolonged and that the amount of suffering which it may entail should not be permitted to go unalleviated."

The statement went on to say that the bishops' opposition "is rooted in the fact that the proposed legislation attempts to give a simple answer to a very complex problem. The non-prolongation of life, while respecting the sanctity of

life, is one of the most difficult problems faced by the physician and other health care personnel.

"We are convinced beyond the shadow of a doubt that the passage of such legislation as that proposed...will not solve the innumerable dilemmas posed by the unnecessary prolongation of a patient's dying. If anything, it will make them worse.

"For that reason, and for those indicated above," said the statement, "we are

unalterably opposed not only to the proposed legislation but also to any attempt to give the force of law to bills which would give legal recognition to "passive euthanasia." The statement said legislative action is not always the answer to society's problems, and called for "serious, dispassionate and charitable discussion by informed competent people throughout the Commonwealth" on the question.
