



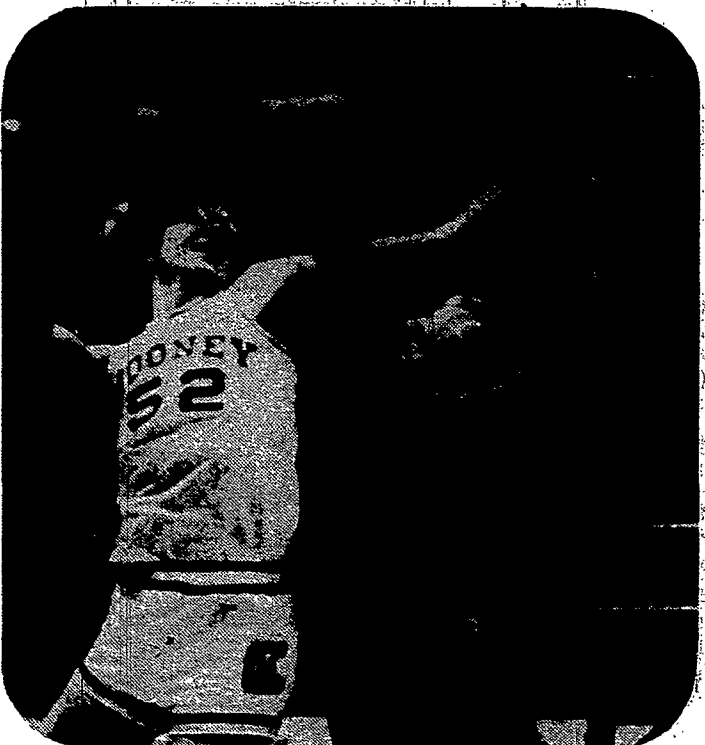
### Toe-tapping Music

## Homell Church Sets Lent Series

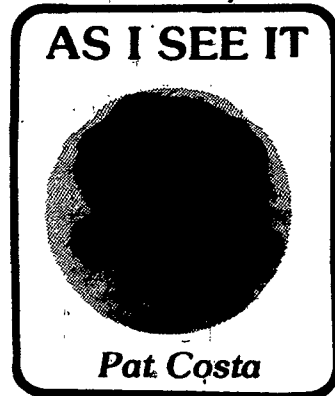
