Black Named Bishop

'They Knew I Was Coming'

New York (RNS) - "They expected me to come down there sometime," Bishop Joseph L. Howze, the newly-appointed Roman Catholic bishop of Biloxi, said of Catholics in his brand new Southeastern Mississippi diocese. "They somehow knew I was coming to be their bishop."

Bishop Howze, the nation's first black Catholic ordinary in 77 years, said he realized that his work in Biloxi will be watched closely because he is "breaking new ground," but he is "very enthusiastic" about the assignment.

"I welcome the chance to justify the Holy Father's trust in me and the opportunity to serve the People of God in the Biloxi area," he said in a telephone interview with Religious News Service.

"It's the best place in the world for me and my ministry, the people - black and white - are tremendous. They have a genuine Christian attitude of openness, generosity and love."

"I don't sense any hostility or antagonism," he stated, noting that he recently officiated at a confirmation ceremony in a

town called Indianola, Miss., which was for the first time fully integrated. "It was beautiful," he said, "everything was integrated, the children, the parents, even the ushers."

Bishop Howze will be taking over a diocese that will include 17 counties on the Gulf Coast, not far from where he was born and raised - "just a stone's

throw across the Alabama border." It is an area which is more heavily Catholic than the rest of Mississippi, with perhaps 9,000 black Catholics concentrated in three counties.

He noted that the area is also one of great need, economically and socially, and indicated that he hoped to play a role in its future development.

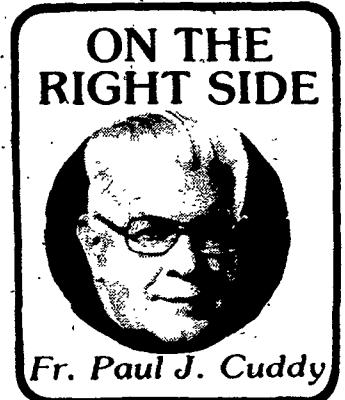
Father Al Delmonte, Father Dick Hart's associate at Guardian Angels, is working a few hours a week at Strong Memorial Hospital to relieve the pressure on Father Holberton. In Elmira, Dr. Joe Egan comes out with an occasional block-buster in his St. Patrick's Bulletin.
