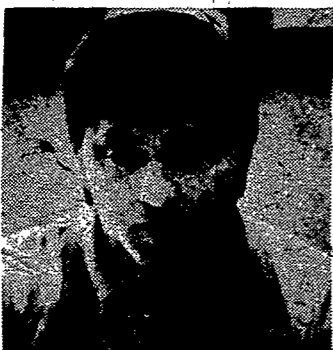
### Sister Julia

Sister Mary Julia Paufler, SSND, religious education director at St. Leo's, Hilton, died March 11, 1977, at the age of 76. The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated Monday night at St. Leo's and the funeral was on Tuesday. Homilist was Father Chester M. Klocek, pastor.

In his homily, Father Klocek said, "We were the beneficiaries of her expertise, her long experience and her knowledge. We always look upon her presence in our midst as a great blessing to our parish. Now that she has departed from this life, we too have suffered a great loss for Sister Julia was a dedicated worker, an able administrator, a great organizer and an outstanding teacher, a teacher in the full sense of the word."

Sister Julia entered the order of the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1919. She taught at Holy Family and the now closed St. Joseph's Commercial School, in Rochester, and at schools in New Jersey, Massachusetts and Maryland. She had been at St. Leo's since 1971.

Sister Julia's survivors are her two sisters Mrs. Joseph A. Eger and Lucy Paufler and her brother David, all of Buffalo.

## School Protests

Continued from Page 1 handles these violations on a confidential basis to protect the person involved and for this reason these situations would not be made public knowledge to the student body.

Ron Robitaille, WROC-TV news director, in talking with the Courier agreed that the school's confidentiality aspect in student discipline was a "valid point." He went on to emphasize that the news feature was not meant as a "put down" to Kearney. He explained that NewsCenter crews had covered three other schools, John Marshall, Penfield High, and Harley-Allendale and would continue to cover the schools in view of the national and local reports of vandalism, theft, drugs and other topics relating to the Channel's features on discipline in the schools. "These interviews cover a diversity of topics," he said and the reporters talk to faculty, students and at times to people living around the campus. They then put together a relevant story which will fit in the limited amount of time allowed for this segment.

The controversy has resulted in thousands of phone calls to the media, calls to the opinion program, statements by councilmen, letters to the editor, newspaper articles and a special commentary by Robitaille on March 16. It has also become apparent that the crisis has produced its advantages.

Brother Stoldt commented, "It appears it is Kearney's finest hour because students faculty and parents have never been so united. Working together against what we feel is an injustice will be beneficial to the school."

And BK is united, especially in the way they rallied behind their principal. Sister Ignatius, vice principal, best summed the school's feelings when she claimed, "I don't know of any school whose principal is more aware of what the students are saying or doing. He is in the corridors, classrooms, the cafeteria, the auditorium, the gym. Wherever students are gathered throughout the school day and after school. He can give answers to any

problems that cannot in any sense of the word be called 'textbook' answers."

What is the prevailing opinion of the news media now at BK? Margaret Mueller declared, "In general the news media does a great service to the community but from what I have seen Channel 8 did a disservice."

Brother Walderman shook his head at what he thought to be the common practice of getting a story to attract people, "using the idea of 'sensationalism.'" Della Vella observed, "If it's Channel 8's idea of increasing their audience I don't approve of it."

How about openness in discussing in-house problems? Students, faculty and administration all agree that this is the best way to find solutions to any problem. "to be open. And that, the interviewed students said, is how they approached the interview; willing to discuss all aspects of discipline, both positive and negative, with openness. But as one of them stated, "It's a shame it was abused."
