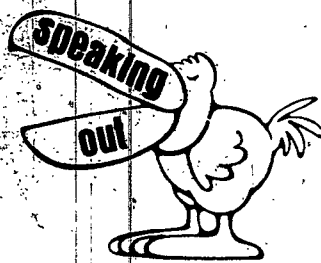

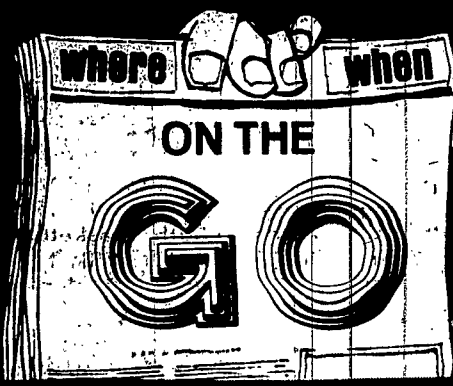
The concert chorus will perform selections by Aaron Copland and from the opera Cavalleria Rusticana.
