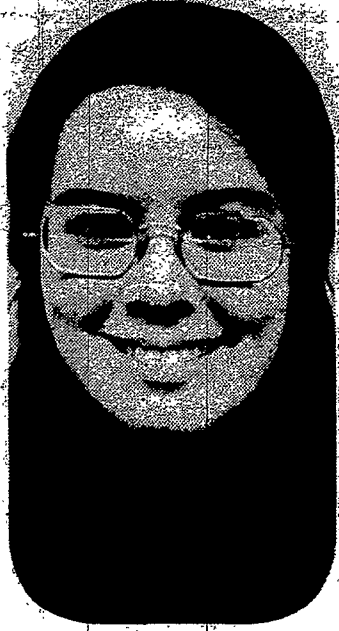

## Con Con Move in Albany

**Huntington Station, N.Y.** — New York State has joined a growing list of more than 20 states in the process of calling on Congress to call for a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment that would protect all human life, including unborn children.

The information was enclosed in a release from the New York State Coalition for Life, a newly-formed group of veteran right-to-lifers, whose sole purpose is urging the call to such a convention. The group is headquartered here under the acting chairmanship of James Ross.

In Albany, Senator Owen Johnson of Babylon, has introduced the move in the Senate. Assemblyman Henry Dwyer of Floral Park has introduced the same measure in the Assembly.

## Proposals Set For DPC Discussion

The Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) agenda for the March 26 meeting includes proposals concerning Natural Family Planning and the appointment of regional liturgy chairpersons, and reports on nursing home ministry, the permanent diaconate, and the Ministerial Review Committee.

The meeting is scheduled for the Sheraton Inn in Canandaigua from 1 to 5 p.m.

Father Louis Hohman will report on the Priests Council response to the proposal that the diocesan liturgy office appoint regional liturgy chairpersons. The proposal, submitted by the DPC Worship and Life Committee, would transfer the responsibility from the regional coordinator.

The proposal on Natural Family Planning calls for the diocese to "set up effective machinery to disseminate

accurate, scientific, usable information on Natural Family Planning as exists in other dioceses with the cooperation of volunteer couples presently engaged in the work."

The proposal explains that "what is needed at this time is financial support" used to "coordinate the activities of the Natural Family Planning volunteer couples." Submitted by Helen Halligan, the proposal estimates first year start up costs of \$14,275 for an office with a part-time secretary.

The council also will review reports from the Nursing Home Task Force, by Sister Judy Reger, SSJ; the Permanent Diaconate Task Force, by Father Sebastian Falcone; and the Ministerial Review Committee by Joseph Mercier.

The DPC will address itself to the diocesan "Call to Action" response at a special meeting April 16.

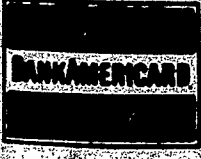
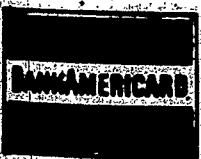
