You have ordered nearly everything that I have ever advertised, so I begin to consider you a pen pal as well as a customer. It is especially good to know that they go to Graymoor. A community is stronger than individual, and I have been saddened by too many modern religious who consider self-fulfillment greater than the Common Good. I think Mother Teresa of Calcutta and her religious are on the right track when they follow the Gospel, with the emphasis on "giving one's life for others": an emphasis on Community over individuality. I have noted over the country that the religious communities who have preserved strong community life, e.g. the IHMs and St. Josephs in Philadelphia have a decent supply of vocations; and the communities who emphasize "self-fulfillment", a danger of sinful pride, are not having vocations. Who would want to join such an outfit anyway?
