



### Director Discusses Jesus Film

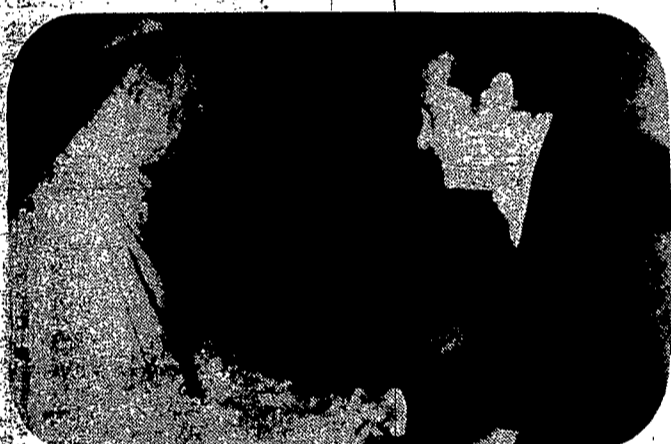

### Pontiff Cites Zeffirelli's Life of Jesus

Vatican City—Pope Paul, in what was seen as an implicit approval of the Franco Zeffirelli film "Jesus of Nazareth," urged the faithful to reflect on its "interior meaning."

The six-hour film is being broadcast by the NBC Television Network (Channel 8, in Rochester). The first three hours were shown on Palm Sunday. The final three are slated bet-

ween 8 and 11 p.m. on Easter Sunday. Vatican Radio has given considerable publicity to the movie, praising it and expressing hope for its "great success."



### Portuguese Premier Meets Pope

The Pope hailed the visit as a public affirmation of Portugal's desire to maintain "traditional relations" with the Apostolic See and expressed hope that Portugal's "well being, founded on social tranquility, peace, and liberty," will be the "fruit of the joint efforts of all Portugal's children."

### 'Great Tragedy' Seen By Deported Bishop

London (RNS) — Catholic Bishop Donald R. Lamont of Umtali, deported by the Ian Smith regime in Rhodesia, told reporters on his arrival here that he was "relieved" to be away from a situation of daily recriminations and acts of violence.

The 65-year-old prelate, a native of County Antrim in Northern Ireland, was expelled for failing to report the presence of black guerrilla forces in his diocese.

He said at a press conference that he was sad his mission work had been interrupted and expressed great concern about the way things are going in Rhodesia.

"I think a great tragedy looms before us unless there is a settlement" of the problems of a country in which minority whites control the lives of millions of blacks.

On May 22, he and President Jimmy Carter are scheduled to receive honorary doctor of law degrees at Notre Dame University in Indiana.
