I would imagine that it would be virtually impossible for a film-maker to produce a life of Jesus that would be acceptable to every viewer. Certainly the recent six-hour effort, "Jesus of Nazareth" by Franco Zeffirelli, had its detractors.

Many thought that Robert Powell as Jesus was too "feline," a euphemism in this case, for effeminate. Others took exception, and rightly so, to such incongruities as Michael York in the role of John the Baptist pouring water over Jesus' head and stealing God's lines for himself: "This is my Beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

For this viewer, who found the production an extraordinary means of absorbing history, getting a new perspective on geography and reinforcing one's faith during Holy Week to say nothing of its being exceptional entertainment, there were disappointments as well.

In a production limited by time, screen writer Anthony Burgess obviously had to pick and choose his miracles and thus we discovered the Marriage Feast at Cana was not

among those to be dramatized. This would not have been particularly important except that it would have shown Jesus and his mother together. In the first installment, at least, I could not recall one scene in which the adult Jesus was shown with either Mary or Joseph. In fact, the only scenes showing them together as a family was on the return to Jerusalem with Jesus still a babe in arms. As a parent and therefore interested in the Holy Family and the quality and the style of their life it would have been extremely gratifying to see the relationship played out and would have helped transition as well.

While Olivia Hussey seemed a particularly good choice to play Mary, managing to convey intelligence, godness and obedience with very few lines, Michael York as John the Baptist came across as more spirited than spiritual. Peter Ustinov's performance as Herod might have been picked up piecemeal from his film performance as Nero while Valentina Cortese as Herodias took all honors for showing us evil personified.

It should be mentioned that Pope Paul VI found the film worthwhile and recommended its viewing.

I think it would have been better if the first installment had started earlier in the evening seeing that the next day was a school day. This film should be around for many years, however, to be screened again and again. On the whole it is recommended for all ages.

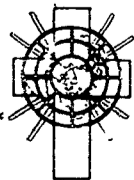
