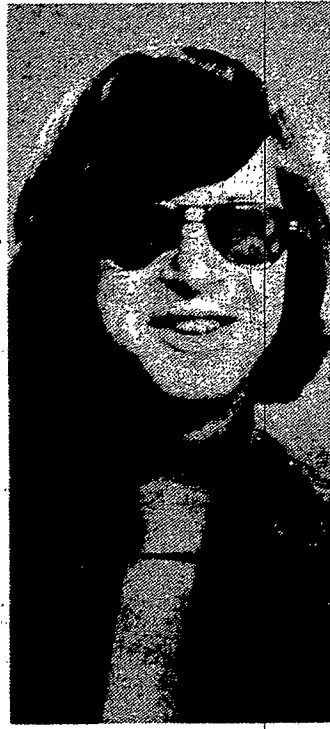

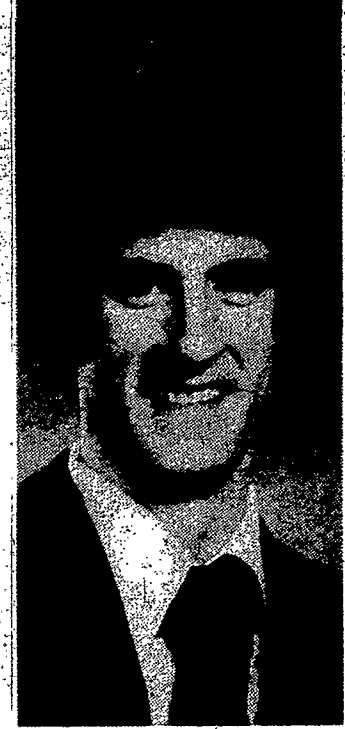

Four seniors from Rochester area Catholic high schools will receive 1977 Eastman Kodak Company Merit Scholarship awards. They are: Robert Deprez and Patrick Fahrer of Bishop Kearney; and Pamela Biracree and James Gendron of Cardinal Mooney. They are among 22 high school seniors, sons and daughters of Kodak people across the U.S. who have earned awards ranging from \$500 to \$3000 annually.

Bob is a collector of coins, antique clocks and vintage phonograph records. He has been president of BK's chess club and editor of the school newspaper, The Coronet. He

plans a mechanical engineering career after graduation from Lafayette College. In addition to the Kodak Scholarship he has won a NYS Regents Scholarship. Bob's father is an engineering supervisor at Kodak Park.

Patrick whose father is in the Motion Picture and Sheet Film Division at Kodak Park is an avid golfer and plans to be an accountant following studies at the University of Pennsylvania. He writes sport stories for the Coronet.

Pam is a youth representative on her parish council (Our Mother of Sorrows), and plans to study engineering before entering

medical school. She is editor of Cardinal Mooney's yearbook, Apogee and a finalist for the alumni group's 'outstanding junior award'. Her father is an electrical engineer at Kodak Park.

Jim is interested in banking and finance and plans a career in law following graduation from LeMoyne College in Syracuse. He has participated in track and field events and collects artifacts related to old breweries. Jim's father is a member of the Kodak Research Laboratories.

Kodak scholarships are renewable and provide each winner with funds for four

years of full-time study or until completion of a bachelor's degree, whichever comes first. The Kodak scholarship program is administered in cooperation with the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

Certificates will be presented at gatherings honoring the academic achievements of these scholarship recipients. Walter A Fallon, Kodak chairman and chief executive officer, and James S. Bruce, vice president, corporate relations, will host a luncheon on Thursday, April 28, at the Kodak Marketing Education Center for the Rochester area recipients and their parents.

Alcohol Program Set for April 27

ND Girls Take Section 4 Tournament

Elmira—The Notre Dame girl's basketball team won its second consecutive Section 4, Class A title with a 56-41 win over Seton Catholic Central of Binghamton April 1.

The Crusaders achieved a unique triple in the tournament, facing and defeating three previously undefeated teams.

Notre Dame entered the tournament with a 9-2 record, in the third seed. After a bye in the first round, they defeated 13-0 Dryden, 59-44, then 13-0 Edison of Elmira Heights, the only team that beat Notre Dame this year, 41-26, and then Seton in the finals, which had a 15-0 record entering the game.

A 19-8 second quarter burst sent the Crusaders to their final win. Debbie Drabinski led Notre Dame in scoring with 25 points; Carol Farmer added 12 and Jean Burke 10.

The title marks the second year that Notre Dame's boys and girls teams have each won the Section 4, Class A tournament.
