ALL IN THE FAMILY

Best selling books, somebody once said, should not be read until they have been around for at least a year. The idea being, possibly, that by that time the hype has worn thin and a reader is able to discern whether the book in question is a flash in the pan which gained its status through adroit and persistent publicity techniques or because of genuine merit.

I seldom read anything less than a year old, but not by choice. Anyone who can fork out \$10.95, the price of "Final Days" or \$12.50 ("Roots") for one book which probably will be read only once, is to be envied.

For \$12.50 I can read the New York Times 50 days in a row, enjoy a six-month subscription to Newsweek or pay the electricity for running the television set for more Saturday afternoons than I can stand to listen to Howard Cosell.

Thus a best seller does not find its way to our house until a. it is reprinted in paperback form; b. I have a birthday and my husband indulges me; or c. I finally remember to put our name on the library reserve list; or, 4. we succumb once again to the lure of a book club.

This past week, the local branch of the library called to tell me that "Final Days," the book about Nixon's last weeks in office was finally available. Two weeks before, a carton of books from the Literary Guild arrived, among which was Alex Haley's masterpiece.

After a concentrated period of reading, I think, after already having waited so long, perhaps it might have been just as wise to

wait a couple more years until the aforementioned works made it to the half-price bookstore.

The account of the collapse of the Nixon administration was, I discovered, past history. Anything of importance had been reported and analyzed beyond interest. Also I wound up feeling a little sorry for Mr. Nixon. I am not yet ready to feel sorry.

"Roots," to which I gave my heart, soul, and 15 hours of viewing time, was another matter. Each night I had watched almost in despair over man's inhumanity to man. But as I opened the book to the chapter of the ocean passage beneath decks the realization dawned that we had not been subjected to half of the horror.

The other books in the carton do not hold much hope for upbeat reading either. "Trinity" by Leon Uris purports to tell the "beautiful and terrible" drama of Ireland. And the two-volume set by John Toland is titled simply "Hitler." So much for best sellers!
