Preparations for Encuentro

Spanish Apostolate Sets Meeting

As part of the preparation for the second national pastoral meeting (encuentro) of U.S. Catholic Spanish-speaking Catholics, a conference on evangelization has been scheduled Saturday, June 11, at St. Francis Xavier School in Rochester.

The national meeting will be convoked by Archbishop Joseph L. Bernardin and will take place Aug. 18-21 in Washington, D.C.

Evangelization will be the theme.

The local meeting will feature Father Casiano Floristan, director of the Pastoral Institute at the University of Salamanca, Spain. He will discuss the meaning of evangelization, the types of evangelization and the topic Evangelization - Liberation or Conversion. The conference, beginning at 9:30 a.m. is sponsored by the

Spanish Apostolate and will be open to all.

Delegates for the national encuentro from Albany, Buffalo, Ogdensburg and Syracuse will meet with Rochester delegates at the St. Francis Xavier conference to discuss points of common interest which they can bring to the national meeting.

Two Rochester delegates to the encuentro will be elected before the June 11 meeting.

Committee Workshop, Retreat Draw 50

Two successful programs for persons active in Southern Tier parishes have been held recently. The first was a retreat for members of parish Human Development Committees, and the second was a workshop for members of Human Development, Liturgy and Education committees.

The retreat was led by Father Charles Mulligan, diocesan Director of Social Ministry, at the rectory in Rexville. Sixteen persons participated, representing each Southern Tier region. The program began Friday night and continued Saturday, and allowed time for prayer, discussion and private reading and reflection. Sister Mary Kruckow, Appalachian Tier Human Development staff, termed the weekend "tremendously successful."

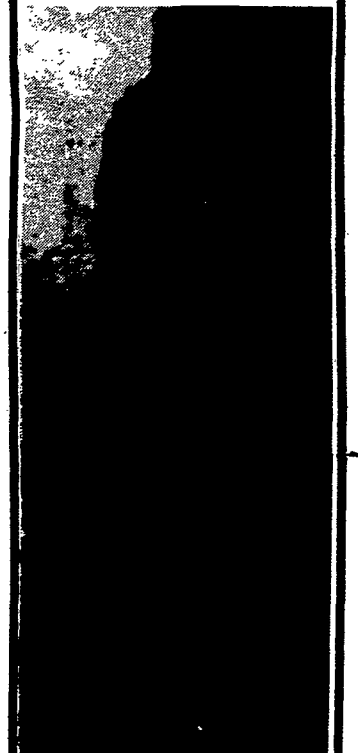
The workshop concentrated on ways for Human Development, Liturgy and Education committees to work together. Forty persons

attended the program, at St. Mary's, Bath, May 14. Father Mulligan was keynote speaker, with the workshops conducted by Father George Wiant, Father Steven Kraus and Mrs. Judy Kollar.

Father Mulligan stressed the importance of unity based on a desire for oneness, according to Sister Mary. Committee members should recognize the gifts of each committee, and look to Christ's life and work for leadership, he noted. Father Mulligan emphasized the importance of prayer, and of listening, hearing and loving for committee members.

The morning workshop dealt with the philosophy and theology of each committee. In the afternoon, groups were formed with representatives from each committee. The groups then worked on an assigned project, preparing a solution to a given problem through cooperation.
