in Rochester. After attending St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, he was ordained by Cardinal Pietro Fumasoni-Biondi on June 11, 1927. He served assignments as administrator of Nativity Parish in Brockport and St. Mary's in Canandaigua, before being assigned as assistant pastor at Immaculate Conception in Ithaca.

He was sent to study at Cornell University for a Doctorate in Philosophy and graduated in June 1932. He was assigned to the faculty of St. Bernard's as professor of Homiletics and English in September of that year. He assisted weekends at Blessed Sacrament. In 1950, he was named rector of St. Andrew's, a post he held until 1956 when he was named pastor of St. Margaret Mary's Church.

For reasons of health, Msgr. Connell retired from the pastorate in June 1968 and took up residence at St. Philip Neri, where his brother, Father Charles Connell, is pastor.

Msgr. Connell has asked family and friends to pray for his intentions as their observance of his anniversary.

## Filter Drive Near Halfway Point

In less than two weeks, the Courier-Journal Filter Campaign has almost reached the halfway point of its drive to have 1,800 families in the diocese contribute \$10 each to purchase decontaminating water filters for 1,800 families in Brazil.

At presstime Monday, more than 800 families had purchased filters for counterparts in Vila Bella, a development for impoverished families in Brazil. Each filter costs \$10.

Vila Bella families get their drinking water from communal, outdoor spigots.

The filters will enable them to run the water through the mechanism, clearing the water of worm organisms which constitute the most prevalent disease among children in the area.

Sister Katherine of the Sisters of St. Joseph who serve as missionaries in Brazil will supervise distribution of the filters. Recipients will be required to attend three classes on their use and on other aspects of personal hygiene before acquiring the filters.
