
**The Church 1977**

One of the worst things about the Catholic Church is that its clergy and religious, like Nazis and Communists, go after the families of people they don't like. I know of one Catholic editor who had to withdraw children from parochial school because the priest and nuns at the parish hassled the kids about the editorials their father wrote.

Get the logic: the kids are to blame for what the father does. The sins of the parents are visited upon their children.

New-Left Jesuit scholastics used to make life miserable for Mayor Daley's sons at St. Ignatius High School. If you don't like the policies of the father, it's all right — if you are a religious — to take it out on his kids.

Priests and nuns can't touch me (save through hate mail), so they go after my sister and her children. Scattered through various levels of Catholic grammar school, high school and college, the nieces and nephews — as well as their mother — are endlessly called upon to "defend" a relative — whom they didn't choose as a relative, but are stuck with. Dr. Willard Gates, Dr. David Grimes and Dr. Jack Smith, names which probably will not go down in history, delivered a short but significant paper to the 14th annual Scientific Meeting of the Association of Planned Parenthood Physicians in Miami Beach, Fla., on Nov. 11, 1976.

Gates, Grimes and Smith are with the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW), Center for Disease Control in Atlanta, Ga. The paper was originally prepared for publication in Advances in Planned Parenthood, and when I first received a copy of it, it had not been cleared for publication. It has since been published in many quarters. With minimal editorial comment, I share with you a small portion of its contents, which will be of value to those who are intellectually curious about the commitments of Planned Parenthood and who want to know more about the organization than is readily available through its public relations department or through the local press.

Sexually transmitted diseases are currently epidemic in the United States. Using data from national surveys of reproductive behavior, we estimate that unwanted

It is surely the case that most priests and nuns have not hassled my family, but only because they haven't had the opportunity. Those that have the opportunity are for the most part eager to take advantage of it.

It's easy to hate priests and nuns.

pregnancy was the second most prevalent sexually-transmitted disease in the country, runner up to gonorrhea. The treatment-of-choice for unwanted pregnancy is legal abortion in the first trimester by suction curettage. Viewing legal abortion as a justifiable treatment for a sexually transmitted disease enables it to qualify for remuneration through Federal and private third party insurance plans.

"We consider unwanted pregnancy as a sexually-transmitted disease. . . We compare the treatment of unwanted pregnancy with that for gonorrhea. . . Unwanted pregnancy occurs primarily in the most sexually active age groups, as do the other sexually-transmitted diseases. . . The barriers used to prevent unwanted pregnancy also serve to prevent 'conventional' venereal diseases. . . If legal abortion were viewed as a justifiable treatment for a sexually-transmitted disease, it would not be considered an 'elective' or a 'preventive' procedure which is usually ineligible for insurance programs. Rather it would be considered a 'curative' treatment, making it eligible for remuneration through Federal and private third party insurance plans.

"In summary therefore it appears that unwanted pregnancy is the second most prevalent sexually-transmitted disease in this country (and) we therefore conclude that unwanted pregnancy should be considered a sexually-transmitted disease of epidemic proportions, legal abortion is the safe, curative treatment of that condition."
