Sisters Sent Forth To South America

A commissioning ceremony was held June 26 at the Mercy motherhouse for three Sisters who have chosen to work in the community's South American mission.

Sister Kay Schwenzer, having finished a year at the Maryknoll Fathers' Institute of Languages in Cochabamba, Bolivia, left two days after the ceremony for Santiago, Chile. Sister Janet Wahl, assistant superior general of the Sisters of Mercy for the past

four years, will begin her Spanish language and culture studies at Cochabamba at the end of August. Sister Margaret Mary Wintish, lately a teacher at St. Cecilia's, Rochester, is scheduled to join the Santiago missionaries in September. She will live with them for six weeks, in San Juan Luis Parish, before undertaking her orientation studies.

The Santiago Mercys are Sisters Janet Korn, Janet Caufield, Jane Kenrick and Margaret Mungovan.

Alfred, Fisher Join In Nursing Program

Registered nurses working in the Rochester area will be able to earn an Alfred University degree, by studying at St. John Fisher College, the two institutions announced last week.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing program which Alfred has offered since 1947 will be given in its entirety on the Fisher campus and at local hospitals. Students will have an Alfred faculty for nursing courses and Fisher teachers in the sciences and humanities.

The cooperative program is designed primarily for the working nurse who would be a part-time student, but it is available also on a full-time

basis to those who have nursing diplomas or associate degrees.

Since 1951, the Alfred nursing program has been centered in Rochester, with students spending their fourth year at Alfred, 70 miles distant. This requirement is waived for continuing education students.

Vatican Praises NFP Movement

Vatican City (RNS)—The Vatican's Secretary of State, Cardinal Jean Villot, has praised the International Federation on Family Action for its "courageous and efficacious initiatives" on natural family planning.

In a letter written on behalf of Pope Paul to the first international congress of the movement held in Cali, Colombia, the cardinal stressed the importance of knowing the biological law for human fertilization for the healthy regulation of births.

The letter, addressed to Mrs. Marie Paul Doyle, federation president, spoke of the "merit" of the international organization which seeks to "overcome

the widespread tendency today which maintains recourse to artificial measures (of birth control)...a problem which engages man in the innermost depth of his being."

Cardinal Villot noted that the federation intends to promote education concerning procreation by means of various methods of natural birth control, and he termed this effort a "means of resolving the problems of world demography in a human way, in full respect for the dignity of the conjugal act and with concern to receive generously the gift of life."

"Behind these problems (of over-population)," the Villot letter continued, "is

at stake the integral development of the person and the couple, the fullness of conjugal love capable of regulating fertility through the wise and effective utilization of fertile periods." He added:

"Equally at stake is the dignity of marriage, the full appreciation of the child—right from conception—and the mission of the family in God's plan."

Cardinal Villot expressed Pope Paul's encouragement to the federation, to those doing research, to the physicians and those "responsible for the promotion of health on the national and international level, that they may study in depth and spread the knowledge of the biological laws of human fertility."

He said this demands an intensification of research, its coordination, as well as the investment of time and money. But he noted that married couples can do much to help other couples to understand and utilize methods of natural family planning and to "experiment with the sanctity and grace of the law which unites the reciprocal love of married couples who cooperate with God's love."

"However," the cardinal observed, "it is necessary to have many specialized teachers, enlightened family consultants and spiritual advisers who will help married couples to face the responsibilities of their love and parenthood. On this depends the building of a world which respects love and life as a gift of God."
