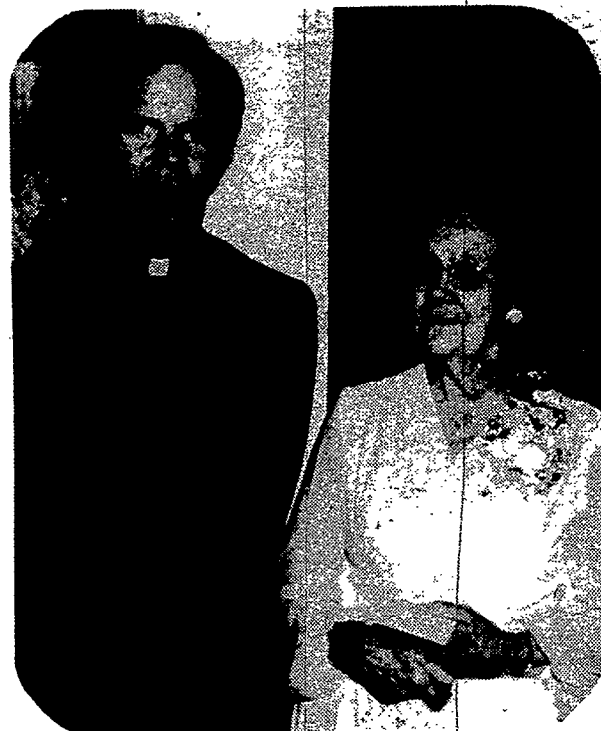

Msgr. John E. Maney, left, and Msgr. James C. McAniff.



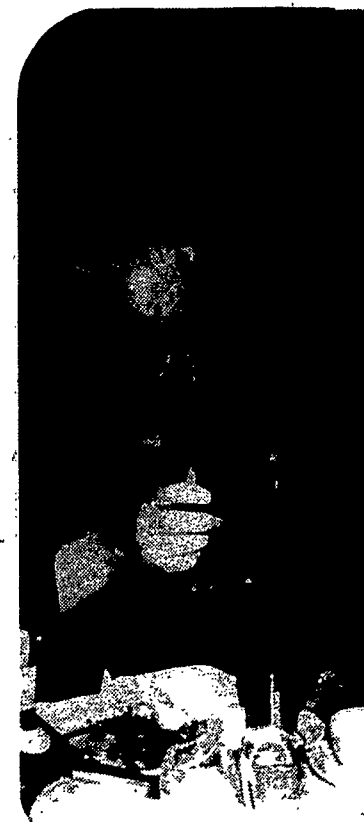
