NFP National Meeting Scheduled

Aug 1-4 are the dates for the Conference on Natural Family Planning for Diocesan personnel. It will be held at Marymont College, Arlington Virginia and will focus on program development on the diocesan level. The nationwide symposium is sponsored by The Human Life Foundation of America; National Family Planning Federation of America; Office for Pro-Life Activities, National Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Family Life Bureau, United States Catholic Conference.

The program will include lectures and workshops dealing with a variety of topics such as program management; curriculum for instructor training, fertility awareness and the Ovulation Method. 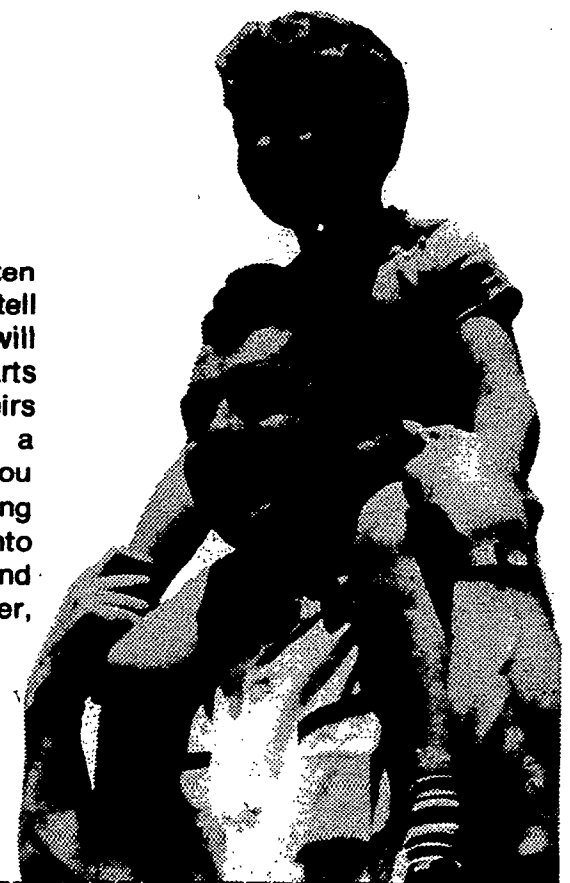
