

Campaigns by concerned citizens to have the forthcoming ABC comedy series "Soap" banned from the air before it ever debuts will have at least one definite effect, according to WOKR-TV program manager Jerry Carr.

"Soap," predicts Carr, will garner the highest rating possible when it hits the TV screen in prime time Tuesday nights this September because its critics have generated priceless publicity.

Carr set to rest the rumors that the local ABC station would not screen the highly controversial sit com to be shown for 30 minutes at 9:30 p.m.

"Not true, not true," Carr said and then struck back at the critics, pointing out that much of what has been written about the series is exaggerated or distorted.

Based loosely on John Erlichman's book it will deal with Watergate.

"I cannot see a network," Carr observed, "coming from behind to be Number 1 with such prestigious programming to sacrifice it all for one half-hour situation comedy."

Viewers, he stressed, should see "Soap" for themselves before making a judgment. In spite of all kinds of misgivings that's the plan here.


A.H. O'Beirne
