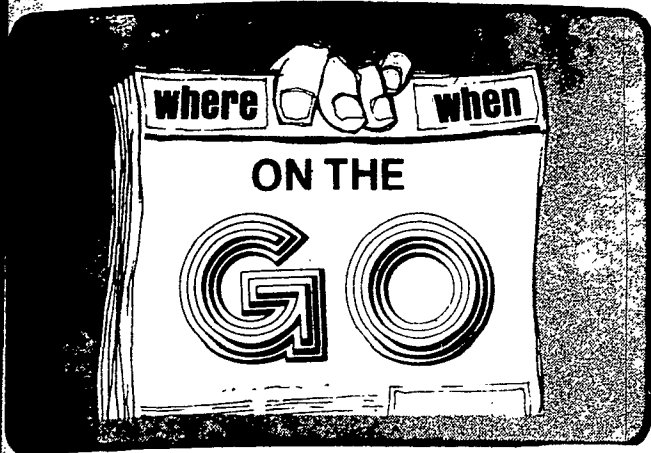

## New Teachers Join Nazareth

Ten new teachers have been added to the Nazareth Academy faculty. Ms. Patricia Perizek and Mrs. Mariangela Annucci have joined the Business Department. Ms. Perizek who has had 10 years experience as a secretary for Eastman Kodak Company will serve as co-moderator of the junior class in addition to her teaching duties. Mrs. Annucci is an alumna of both Nazareth Academy and Nazareth College, has taught in the Greece Central and Rochester City School Districts and an evening adult course at Rochester Business Institute.

Mrs. Adelita Menges will teach Theology classes. She pursued her theological studies at Colgate Rochester Divinity School and St. Bernard's Seminary. She also has been a religious education coordinator and has taught in the Adult Education Program organized through the Diocesan Pastoral Center and the regions.

On a one year sabbatical from her missionary work in

Brazil, Sister Mary Ann Mayer will teach Social Studies. In addition to teaching European Cultures, Sister has developed an Hispanic Cultures elective open to interested seniors.

Four English teachers have also joined the staff. Miss Ellen Secci, who did her practice teaching at the school, will be teaching drama and English III. Miss Sheila Chatterton from Holy Rosary School will teach freshmen and sophomore courses. Miss Annette Gianforte will teach the 10th grade speech program and English III. Sister Mary Elizabeth, a reading specialist with experience in administration on the elementary school level, will teach freshman reading and a senior elective in improving Study Skills.

Sisters Diana Dolce and Jeanne Marie Day, both from St. Joseph's Villa where they worked with educationally disadvantaged adolescents, will direct a program designed to strengthen basic learning skills of 9th and 10th graders.

## Aquinas Sets Workshop

A Creative Ceramic Workshop for adults will be held at Aquinas Institute beginning on Monday evening, Oct. 3.










The course will run for 12 weeks and will teach wheel-throwing and hand building in clay. No molds will be used and students will be given extensive time working on the wheel. Tuition is \$60.
