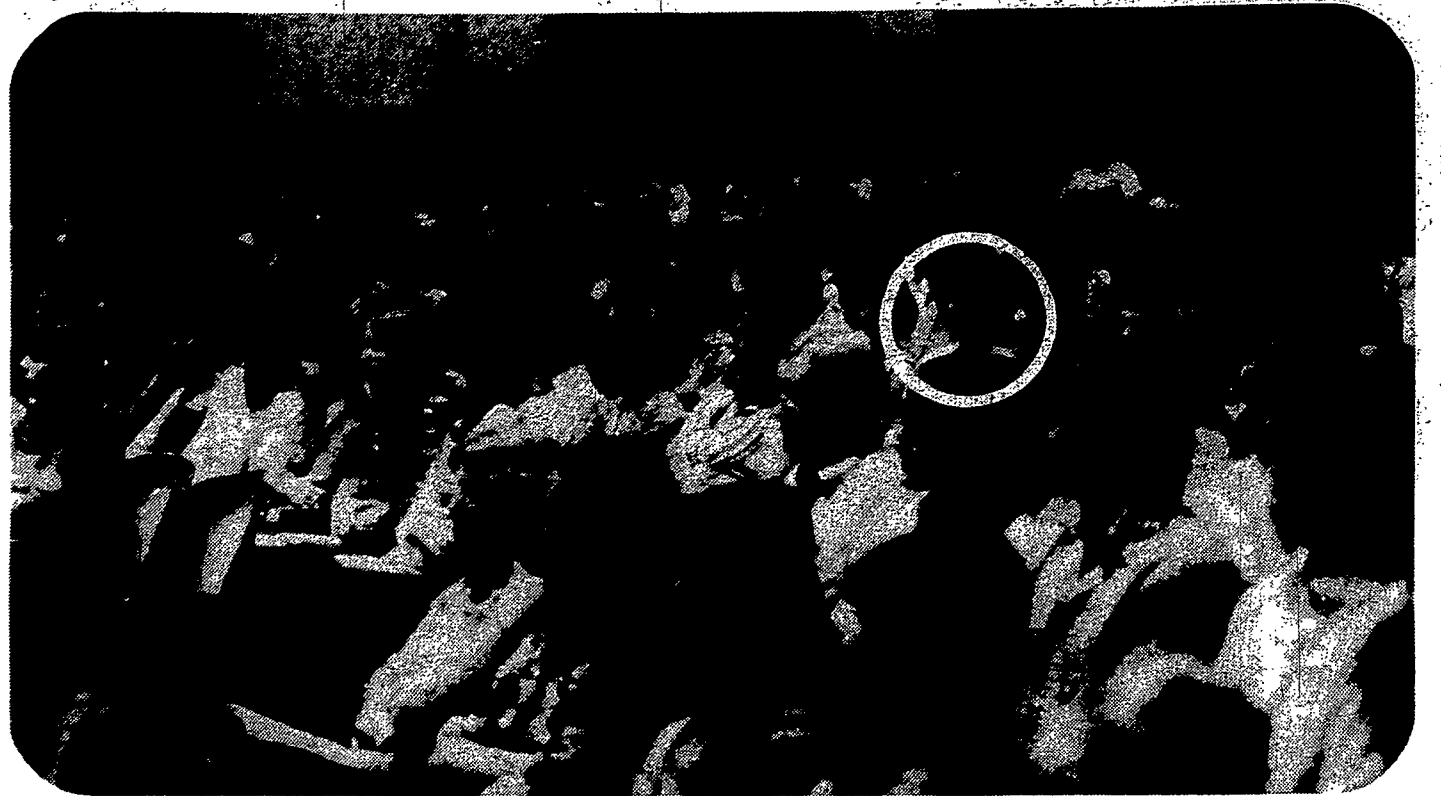
The Junior Achievement staff will visit 40 high schools' public and parochial, in Monroe and Wayne Counties, Sept 19-Oct 7. The purpose is to recruit students for the 1977-78 Junior Achievement Program.

Method of recruiting is by general assemblies and live public address announcements. The organization has set a goal of 1,300 students to operate 45 companies during the new year.

After all schools have been recruited, students will be assigned to groups of 35 and with the help of ad-

visers from local businesses and industries will form the Junior Achievement company structure. Each company will meet one night a week in one of the following business centers: Rochester Institute of Technology Metro Center at 50 West Main St., Eastridge High School, Sperry High School, Hoover Drive School, Schroeder High School and Pittsford Recreational Center.

Recruiting dates are: Sept 23 at Aquinas, Sept 27 at Cardinal Mooney, Sept 28 at St. Agnes, Sept 29, McQuaid, Oct 3, Nazareth and on Oct 4 at Bishop Kearney.

## Lawyers to Aid In Classroom Studies

Over 100 members of the Monroe County Bar Association have volunteered to assist junior and senior high school social studies and business law students in their law-related courses.

The program, entitled Lawyer in the Classroom, brings attorneys and teachers together in working with students who are studying law.

In cooperation with the New York Bar Association's Institute on Law and the Social Studies and its project director Peter Knapp, a teacher at R.L. Thomas High School, the program will focus on using attorneys in the classroom for special projects, case study work, field trips and their preparation, mock trials, and law course curriculum. Attorneys will also be asked to give presentations on areas of the law they have selected including business law, consumer law, law as a career, poverty law, juvenile rights, trial practice, and First Amendment freedoms.

A brochure has been prepared and sent to nearly

600 social studies and business law teachers in Monroe County.

The Bar Association will continue to make speakers available through its Speakers Bureau to community organizations and agencies. The Lawyer in the Classroom is intended to focus more specifically on the individual needs of teachers in their law classes and give students direct contact with practicing attorneys.
