The Mass: A Time for Sharing

Since Vatican II, active participation in the Mass has given people a sense of involvement with their religion. And nowhere has this activism been more enthusiastically utilized than in the Catholic high schools.

Student liturgy committees have become an integral part of a student's school life. According to the young liturgists at Geneva DeSales, this ability to contribute has generated an immense interest in the Mass; especially the class Masses.

The endeavor to personalize Masses with the individuality of each class is a challenge well met by their respective liturgy committees. The members, who junior Tina Lorsong said are changed with every Mass to give all students a chance, devote their time during lunch and after school to deciding upon themes, selecting gospel readings, choosing and practicing the music. But their commitment doesn't end with the planning. They produce total involvement in the celebration by giving their classmates the opportunity to give the readings, present the gifts, and play the accompanying music.

For the junior's Mass on Sept. 21, celebrated by Father Albert Shamon of St. Mary's Waterloo, Tina and her committee helped Denise Porterfield, Karen Cannuli and Holly Cortelyou picked the theme "Come Follow Me," and selected the gospel in which Jesus called St. Matthew. The musical selections centered around the giving of oneself as Jesus gave of himself.

"Kids like the school Masses because they can actively participate," declared Maria Koebel, a senior who recently worked on her class's liturgy said by Father John Quinn of St. Stephen's. The class of '78 chose the Mass of the Holy Spirit and emphasized how

He helps people become closer to God. A unique touch was that instead of a New Testament reading, parts of the Diary of Anne Frank were excerpted and attention drawn to her philosophy of "being yourself."

The sophomores, for their Mass on Friday, Sept. 23, picked the theme Friendship and Brotherhood. Their readings, taken from a religious book on friendship and their music projected this theme and also reflected the community spirit of the DeSales family.

Besides the class Masses, the students have a hand in planning the holy day and Lenten Masses as well as the Seder Supper — the re-enactment of the Last Supper.
