

There is a notable shift to the right going on in American Catholicism. don't mean the manic right of Archbishop Lefebvre or the pragmatic right of the bishops, or "The Wanderer"; I mean rather a large and intellectually respectable right. I'm a afraid I've missed it for a long time; it's a relief to discover it, though. I'd much rather fight the right than the left.

There are three components of right-wing ideology clericalism, pietism and antiintellectualism. They are all around us.

Consider:

--Item: The opposition on principled grounds of such scholars as David Burrell and Michael Novak to the ordination of women. Mr. Novak even "feels that such ordination would deny the reality of the flesh" (how do you argue with that?).

--Item: Under Burrell's leadership dissidents have been purged from the Notre Dame theology department regardless of their professional accomplishments or reputation, and the Mennonite pietism of Yoder's The Politics of Jesus has become the guiding ethos of Notre Dame theology (appropriate enough, guess, in the place where Catholic pentecostalism

--Item: The editorial board of "Theological Studies" decided to print a monstrously unfair and unprofessional attack by Peter Berger on the orthodoxy of David Tracy,



Langdon Gilkey and Schubert Ogden – an attack which distorts beyond recognition the work of the first two. Curiously enough the three scholars were orthodox enough to be invited to sign the "Hartford Statement" of Berger and his friend, Richard John Neuhaus. They became unorthodox, I guess, when they refused to sign; and 'Theological Studies' printed the attack.

Why the turn to the right? Partly I think because the liberals of the 60s (like Burrell and Novak) are getting old and tired, partly because many think it is the only way to save the church amid the current chaos, partly because men like Novak are rightly horrified by the attack on the family from the authoritarian left and the support for this attack by some of the liberals within the church, partly because the task of translating the old tradition into contemporary terms is difficult and it is so much easier to repeat the old terminology

I don't think the shift to the right will be all that important beyond the elites Most communal Catholics are solid moderates who were unaffected by the Berrigan new leftism of the 60s and will be equally unaffected by the Novak-Burrell new rightism of the 70s.
