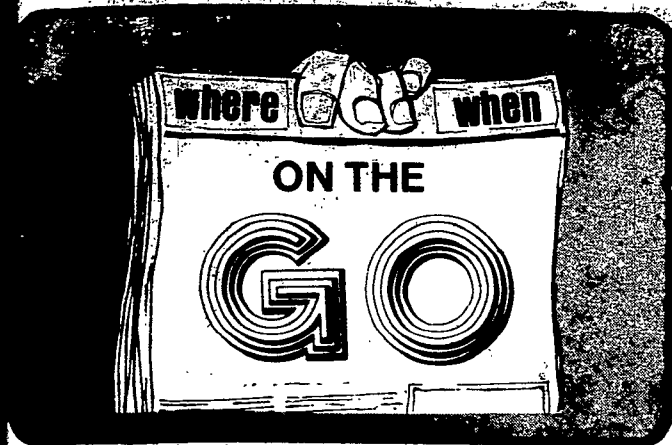

While many Notre Dame students were tanning and boating this summer, Scott 'Bulldog' Sheehan was competing in the U.S. Wrestling Federation National Tournament. Scott qualified for the tournament by placing second in the U.S. Wrestling Federation New York State Tournament.

Prior to the Nationals, Scott attended a week long training camp for the NYS team held at Hofstra University on Long Island. The camp program consisted of three 2 hour workouts in addition to a five mile run each morning. After the week the team left by bus for the Iowa held tournament. Along the way the team stayed with wrestlers from other states and scrimmaged other state teams. Scott's record for these scrimmages was 4-0 while his tournament record was 3-2.

Scott was supported by the ND Athletic Association, Student Council, the junior class and the Southern Tier Wrestling Club and he acknowledged, "It was great knowing Notre Dame supported me like they did."
