THE OPEN WINDOW

Dear Father Hohman:
 Since ecumenism has become pretty much accepted even in official circles in our Church, and we even recognize in certain instances healings which take place under auspices other than Catholic, how is it that there's no Protestant or other person who is not a Catholic or a Christian among the canonized saints? Could there ever be one?

Dear C.L.:
 The key word here, of course, is "canonized." You must realize that canonization is a legal term involving a process in a kind of court declaring a person to have been of heroic sanctity in his or her life. The Church fully realizes that there are and have been thousands of individuals leading lives of heroic sanctity while only a few are brought to public attention. Canonization is of fairly recent origin in the Church. In the Early Church it was only by tradition that people were declared saints

and were venerated as such. Because canonization is a legal process of the Roman Catholic Church, I believe that no persons except Roman Catholics will be canonized in the foreseeable future. However, if we put a broader definition on heroic sanctity, which we must, then de facto any person who possessed those qualifications would be at least theoretically eligible for canonization. That wider definition would simply be a living to the full in a heroic manner of the Christian life as such, without previous reference to a denomination
