**James Cameron Will Inaugurate Kearney Series**

James M. Cameron, University of St. Michael's College Professor, will be the first speaker in the recently established Bishop James E. Kearney Lecture Series. Dr. Cameron will speak on "The Idea of the University," at St. John Fisher College on Thursday, Nov. 10 at 8 p.m.

The Bishop James E. Kearney Lecture Series is the result of an anonymous donation to the college. In making the gift, the donor expressed his hope that three of the late bishop's favorite authors — John Henry Newman, G.K. Chesterton, and William Shakespeare — would be the subjects of some of the lectures in the years to come. For many years, the former Bishop of Rochester was the national chaplain of the Newman Club Association.

The speaker of the inaugural lecture has been St. Michael's College Professor since 1971. Born in 1910 at Manchester, England, Dr. Cameron received a degree in philosophy, politics and economics in 1931 from Oxford University. He lectured at the Universities of Southampton and Leicester before joining the faculty at the University of Leeds in 1943. In 1960, he was named chairman of philosophy at Leeds, a position he held for seven years. From 1967 to 1971, he was professor of philosophy and Master of Ruthertord College at the University of Kent in Canterbury, England.

Dr. Cameron has published several books, including "John Henry Newman, Images of Authority." He is a regular contributor to the New York Times Review of Books.

The Hyde Amendment to the HEW-Labor Appropriations Bill which would prohibit Medicaid funds for abortion except to save the life of the mother is back in the House Conference Committee. It is urgent that we continue to advise our representatives that we do not want our tax dollars used to pay for abortions.

**Suggested Action:** — Contact your congressman by telegram, letter or telephone. Urge him to support or continue to support the language in the current law (Hyde Amendment) which would prohibit Medicaid funds for abortion except to save the life of the mother.

Also contact the following congressmen who are on the Conference Committee. Urge that they go back to their original positions — to the language

now in the law (Hyde Amendment).
