Bishops Nominate 10 For NCCB

Washington (RNS) — Ten bishops have been named candidates for the offices of president and vice president of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops and the United States Catholic Conference.

bishops' meeting here Nov. 14 to 17.

Each American bishop was asked to submit five names for the posts. The 10 prelates on the slate most frequently mentioned and who accepted nomination for the two offices are:

Cardinal William Baum of Washington, Cardinal Terence Cooke of New York, Archbishop Thomas A. Donnellan of Atlanta, Bishop James W. Malone of Youngstown, Archbishop

Edward A. McCarthy of Miami, Bishop Joseph A. McNicholas of Springfield, Ill., Bishop Cletus F. O'Donnell of Madison, Wis., Archbishop John R. Quinn of San Francisco, Archbishop John R. Roach of St. Paul-Minneapolis, and Archbishop John F. Whelan of Hartford.

The president will be elected at the Fall meeting by a simple majority vote. If a simple majority is not received on the first or second ballot, the two candidates receiving highest votes on the second ballot will be the candidates on the third and final ballot. The same procedure will be used to elect the vice president from the remaining nine candidates.

Test Case Looms on Exemptions

Albany (RNS) — New York State has barred property tax exemptions that were granted to "mail order" ministers of the Universal Life Church, directing that their properties be placed on the tax rolls immediately.

A spokesman for the state Board of Equalization and Assessment said the decision marked the first time in the board's 28-year history that such an order had been issued. The order was sent to four tax assessors who had granted religious tax exemptions.

Robert Kerwick, one of the assessors served with the directive, said he will ignore the order. "I don't care what order I get," he maintained.

Kerwick, town assessor of Hardenburgh, filed a tax roll in July granting tax exemption to 90 per cent of the town's 236 residents. Some 213 residents claimed to be ministers of the California-based church which grants mail order ordinations upon payment.

Also receiving the order were tax assessors in Liberty, two exemptions; Rochester, 16 exemptions; and New Paltz, one exemption.

State board spokesman Humphrey Tyler said the issue would be appealed in court if the assessors refused to comply.

Hardenburgh officials reported in January that they planned to grant the exemptions to Universal Life Church members to create a test case. State tax officials have reportedly warned that Universal Life members are not eligible for tax exemption.

Kerwick said other religious organizations in the area have tax-exempt status and he intended to "enforce the law equally."

POISON POSTER

The Red Cross is distributing a poster outlining first aid measures for dealing with internal poisoning. It sets forth the latest information from the National Academy of Sciences—National Research Council, according to Rita Swank, director of safety programs for the local Red Cross. One of the academy's latest findings, she said, is that vomiting should not be induced in poison victims except on the advice of a doctor or the Poison Control Center. Household and campers are urged to pick up copies of the poster at 50 Prince St., or to send stamped self-addressed envelopes to "Poison Poster," at the same address. Swank noted that instructions found on container labels may be incorrect.

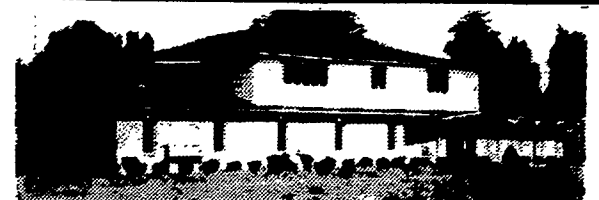
