

Your letter came in the mail just two days after I had assisted at a wedding in Trinity Lutheran Church in Spencerport, along with the Rev. Charles Goehring. I have no idea whether that is the one you are referring to, or another one, since this is a relatively common oc-currence at this time. It comes under what is known as a dispensation from form. The ordinary form for a marriage is before a priest and two witnesses, and the ordinary place for a marriage involving a Catholic is a Catholic church. How.
