Missioner Expelled from Rhodesia Says Church Does Too Little There

Sister Janice McLaughlin, MM, the Maryknoll missioner who recently was expelled from Rhodesia after arrest and detainment, spoke last week in Rochester at the invitation of the Office of Black Ministries.

According to Father Jerome Robinson, OP, director of that office, a number of other groups joined in the sponsorship of her presence in the area. Among them are the diocesan International Justice and Peace Commission, the Rochester Peace and Justice Education Center and the Pan-African Reading and Research Committee.

Sister Janice had been serving the Catholic conference of bishops in Rhodesia "on loan" from the similar body of Kenya. For both groups she acts as a researcher and it was her work toward a pastoral letter describing racial conditions in Rhodesia that brought about her arrest.

Father Robinson describes her as "a soft-spoken, gentle, ministerial woman who doesn't attempt to editorialize or politicize." She sees her role, he said, simply "as trying to serve the Church."

Her comments focussed on the Rhodesian situation and her own arrest, Father Robinson noted.

He said that while she was detained she felt that "as a white woman and as a nun

she was in far less danger," in what were "brutal" and "painful" conditions than the black women who were her prison-mates.

She expects, he said, that her release from prison was due to "Vatican intervention" in her case, though when she tried to verify what had happened she was asked by the U.S. bishops' headquarters in Washington, D.C. not to pursue her inquiry.

Three laymen still await trial in Rhodesia in connection with the same case, Father Robinson said.

The charges against her include disturbing the peace and breach of civil order.

Father Robinson noted that Sister Janice feels that the "Catholic Church in Rhodesia, while it has done a great deal, nevertheless has not done enough." He said that Rhodesia claims about 40 per cent of its white population to be Catholic, 10 per cent of its black population also Catholic. "The Church has not done what it could," he quoted her as saying.

More than once, he said, attorneys for the Rhodesian bishops have cautioned them against actions for fear of reprisals from the government.

Sister Janice, who last Friday was awarded the Martin Luther King Freedom Award by the Council of Churches of New York City, encourages Americans not

to be content with accounts of Rhodesia in the American press, he said. She feels, he noted, that material directly from Rhodesia is more instructive on the situation

than what has been transmitted to the U.S.

Sister Janice will resume her former position in Kenya before the end of the year.
