## Seven Student Councils Unite

Student councils are an integral part of any high school and over the years have become more than token representatives of the student body. Like Nazareth Academy's organization, headed by senior Cory Schultz, they are involved in motivating student school and community interests and projects. Now through the efforts of all seven Rochester Catholic high schools a United Student Council Association (USCA) has become fact.

In October, the St. Agnes Student Senate sponsored a picnic in Genesee Valley Park for all student councils, their officers and moderators. It was at this get-together the idea of a USCA was kicked around. The idea took hold and on Nov. 2 the first USCA meeting was held at Aquinas.

Nannette Nocon, president of the St. Agnes senate, has high hopes for the association. "I see it working this year and into the next," she declared.

She acknowledged it will mean double duty for her as well as all the other student council officers because of the need to participate in additional meetings, assessing what is planned and then presenting it to their respective school administrations. Nannette, however, considers the effort worthwhile especially since the endeavor has met with such enthusiasm from all the schools.

According to Cory, USCA's goal "is to share ideas in the social and educational aspects of all the schools," and she was pleased with the first meeting's achievements. She did, however, admit to having been dubious about the undertaking because she hadn't known what to expect. The meeting turned out to be a success and she attributed this to the organizational efforts like the uses of parliamentary procedure, and written agenda. There was no question in her mind that efficient organization is half the battle in achieving success in any project.

Had it been difficult forming a working unit with so many council reps each with their own ideas? Not at all Cory said adding,

"Everyone was able to get their ideas across. We accomplished a lot, many questions were asked ... and there was much sharing of ideas between the schools."

The meeting produced concrete results like the Student Exchange Program which was initiated on Monday Dec. 5. (Mercy girls taking classes at McQuaid — Aq students over at St. Agnes etc). If it works out there will be one scheduled for the first Monday of every month. The program isn't a new idea. In previous years schools have had such days but on an individual basis. This is the first united operation involving all the schools at the same time.

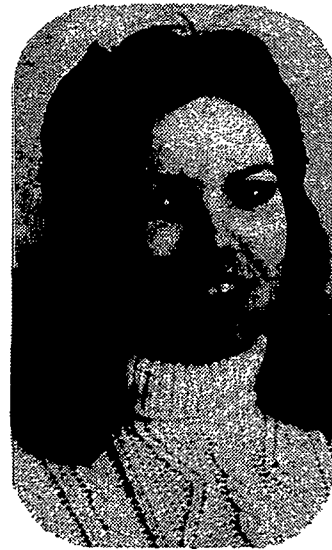
At the next USCA meeting, in January at Bishop Kearney, the representatives' prime duty will be to evaluate the
