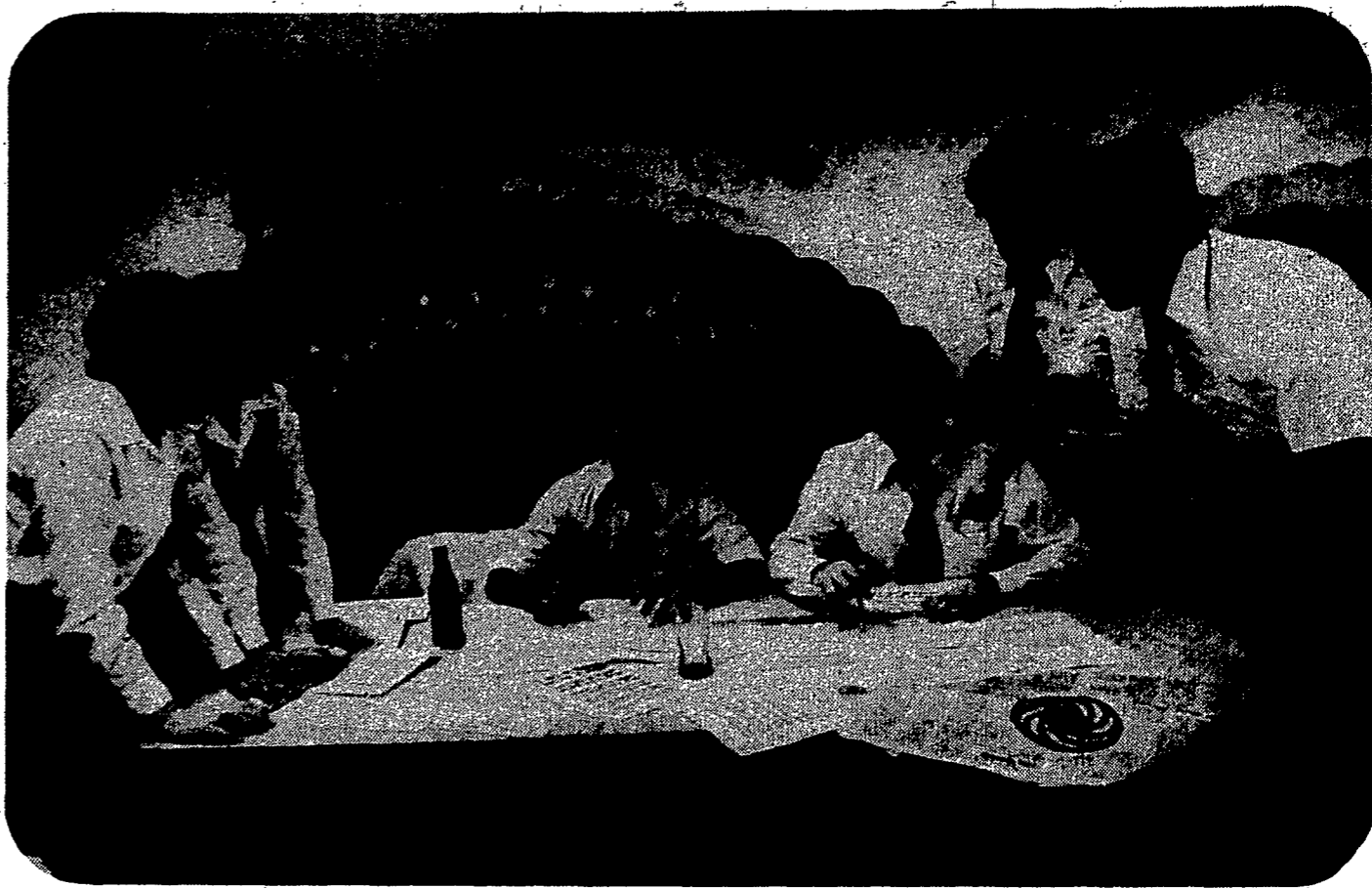

Bored, however, isn't what the BKers were when they perused the November issue which introduced them to new creative art designs, in-depth reporting and a surprise addition. The staff, under the direction of Sister Evelyn Breslin, had decided on a new format - combining school news with outside features such as Len's radio station article and Steve Salerno's two page informational article on The Center, dealing with youth services.

Len who has been associated with the Coronet for three years has found the time well spent especially in preparing him for the journalism course at Marquette University.

Steve who is assistant editor and another three-year veteran not only writes for the paper but aids with the graphic designs. Artistry must run in the family because it was Steve's brother Ronald who designed the Coronet's new larger masthead. Contributions to the newspaper are welcomed from all students, and the staff hopes the more interesting format will entice the students to write.

The Coronet, even without its new look, has

had a prestigious run of awards - a first place rating this Fall from the Empire State Press Association - a 1976 first place rating from the Columbia Press. The paper will be entered in this year's National Scholastic, Columbia and St. Bonaventure Press competitions.

Health

As part of a city-wide study, Nazareth Academy sophomores were recently tested for hypertension. Each girl's blood pressure was taken following instruction by school health teachers regarding hypertension, the meaning of blood pressure and how it is computed.

The survey will gather data about students who have a tendency toward high blood pressure: School nurse, Mrs. Helen Klein, will follow up on those with problems and will make appropriate recommendations to the family or school doctor.

Doctors concerned about the higher incidence of hypertension evident in young people hope to allay it before it becomes a major problem.
