Pope Plans Full Slate For Holidays

Vatican City (RNS) — Pope Paul is planning on a full round of traditional activities during the Christmas period.

According to a Vatican announcement, the Pope will meet on Dec. 22 with members of the College of Cardinals and other officials of the Roman Curia, the central administrative arm of the Church, in a traditional exchange of Christmas wishes.

He will celebrate mid-night Mass and preach on Dec. 24 in St. Peter's Basilica. On Christmas day, he will again celebrate Mass in the basilica at 10:45 p.m.

Afterwards, following custom, he will deliver his Christmas message from the outer balcony of the basilica and impart his blessing "Urbi et Orbi" (to the City of Rome and the world).

The pontiff will celebrate Mass at 10 a.m. on Sunday, Jan. 1, in Rome's Basilica of St. Mary Major.

Tompkins-Tioga Assembly Evaluated

Owego — The 43 regional delegates and parish council members who attended the Tompkins-Tioga Regional Assembly Oct. 16 at St. Margaret Mary, Apalachin, generally approved of the program, an evaluation has revealed. The program, conducted by Sister Jean Rodman of the Office of Pastoral Ministry, was intended to broaden the participants' understanding of Church and of their role in it.

The evaluation report is in the December issue of "Moorings," the regional newsletter, compiled by Father Albert Cason, regional coordinator and co-pastor of St. Patrick's, Owego.

Each of four key questions received at least 35 positive responses. Responded to most favorably, with 32 "yes" answers and seven "somewhat" responses, was the question "Has this workshop increased my awareness of my own vision of Church?"

The regional executive committee summarized the

evaluation, noting "the most effective thing about the workshop seems to have been the fact that we were able to share ideas in the small group discussions and thus were able to better appreciate our own view of Church. Suggestions for improving the workshop included more time, and a more central location."

'Correct Injustice,' Pope Tells El Salvador

Vatican City (RNS) — Pope Paul told the new Ambassador from El Salvador to the Vatican that he supported the efforts of Salvadoreans to improve their lot and construct a society free of "evident injustice."

Ambassador Prudencio Schonenberg presented his credentials to the Pope at an audience on Dec. 15.

The Roman Catholic Church in the predominantly Catholic Central American country has come under attack from right-wing groups, with the

alleged connivance of the government.

Catholic priests have been accused of stirring up the country's poor, a majority, to demand better economic opportunities. Within the past year, two priests and two Catholic lay leaders have been killed, 15 priests have been deported, five others have been denied re-entry, and three have said they were tortured.

A right-wing terrorist group told El Salvador's 47 Jesuit priests to leave the

country by last July 20 or face assassination. The government of General Carlos Humberto Romero, which previously had indicated sympathy with right-wing accusations, deployed police and military protection for the Jesuits in the glare of world attention.

The Jesuits were accused of "Communist subversion" for speaking out for better economic and social opportunities for El Salvador's poor.

The Jesuits and other priests, with the backing of El Salvador's bishops, have been pressing the government to enact a broad land reform program. Since the 16th Century, the land has been divided into vast cotton and coffee farms held by a relatively few families.

Pope Paul, in his remarks to Ambassador Schonenberg, underscored the importance of the involvement of El Salvador's people "in the quest for social justice."

Msgr. Rodimer to Be Bishop of Paterson

Washington, D.C. (RNS) — Msgr. Frank J. Rodimer, chancellor of the Paterson, N.J., Catholic diocese and administrator of that see since last June when Bishop Lawrence B. Casey died, has been named the sixth bishop of Paterson. According to a diocesan spokesman, he is the first priest from the 40-year old diocese to be named to the hierarchy.
