#### **Peace Demonstration**

The demon-stration consisted of a march through downtown Rochester led by James Renfrew, Deacon Daniel O'Shea and Karen McNamera; and the dedication of Rochester's War Memorial as a "peace memorial" and the planting of a tree on the War Memorial's grounds. The Catholic Worker community operates a multi-faceted service center for those in need.



#### Dear Father Hohman,

Please - how do I cope with a teenage daughter who has had an abortion? She attends a Catholic school and has not gone to confession or communion for months because they are "meaningless" to her, and will not go now because she is "not sorry." How do I survive Christmas, when we celebrate a baby's birth? How do I treat this girl who actually repels me? She claims not to understand why I'm upset — after all, it's" 'her problem."

#### Dear Please,

What your daughter needs now more than

anything is understanding. The abortion is a fact and there is nothing in the world that can be done to undo it. The fact that she has not gone to confession or communion for months has nothing to do with their being meaningless. It has only to do with the fact that she feels terribly alienated. She must necessarily feel not sorry, because the effects of what she has done are in a very real sense getting her off the hook. But it is also possible for her to be sorry that the whole thing happened

When you ask how you survive Christmas when we celebrate a baby's birth, my answer would be that you at least try to share this with your daughter in as gentle and as understanding a way as possible. Maybe that will be the door which opens to her understanding the sacredness of life. Your daughter should not repel you. I think she is largely the victim of a society which so easily condones this kind of disrespect for life. Step by step you should try to lead her back not only to a respect for life but to a

respect for herself. When

she says it is her problem she is trying to eliminate you from the whole issue and to make it sound as though she does not want any kind of reassurance or help. Nothing could be further from the truth.

How do you suppose lesus would have reacted to your daughter?

Denouncing violence as 'anti-social'' and "degenerate," the Pope stated that "violence leads to revolution and revolution to the loss of freedom. Those who live by the sword shall perish by the sword."

Returning to the theme of modern war and its 'irrationality," the Pope reiterated the theme of his 1977 peace day message, "If you want peace, defend life.

"Peace," he said, "must be brought not only to battlefields, but wherever human existence is extant. There is a peace that not only (guards against) the weapons of war, but also protects life, as such, against every peril, every misfortune, every insidious attack.
