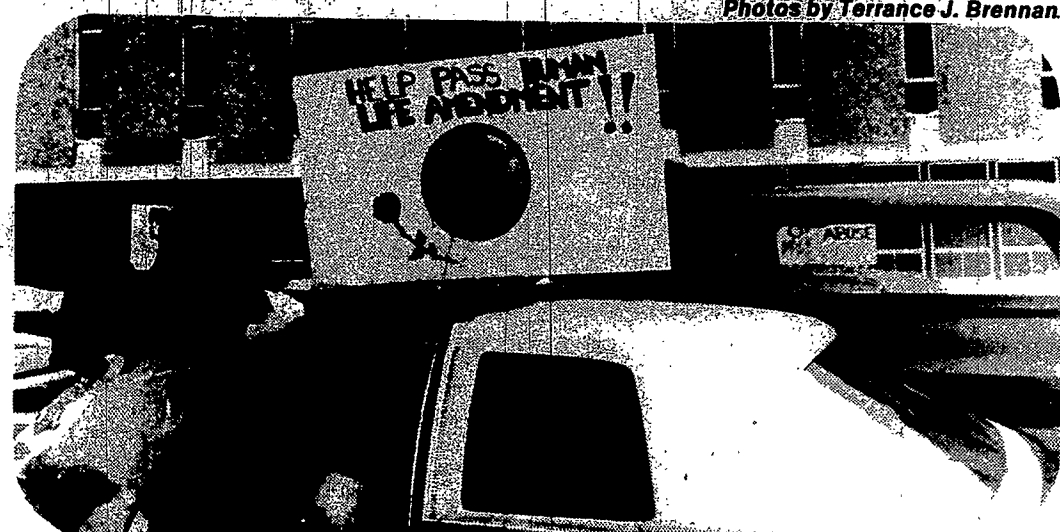




Fight for Right

Crociata received his bachelor's degree from St. John Fisher College and did additional undergraduate and graduate studies at the University of Rochester and in the music department of Nazareth College.

Latin America To Be Topic Of Lecturer

Richard Alan White, an expert on Latin American history and Paraguay, will speak at 7:30 p.m., Monday, Jan. 30, at the Downtown United Presbyterian Church, 121 N. Fitzhugh St. He will be representing Amnesty International and his topic will concern human rights violations in Paraguay.

He has taught and studied in Mexico, Chile, and Paraguay and participated in the Conference on Implementing a Human Rights Commitment in U.S. Foreign Policy, sponsored by the International League for Human Rights in 1977.

Amnesty International, a worldwide movement centered in London, works in behalf of prisoners of conscience. It has reported violations of human rights and a continuing level of repression in Paraguay.

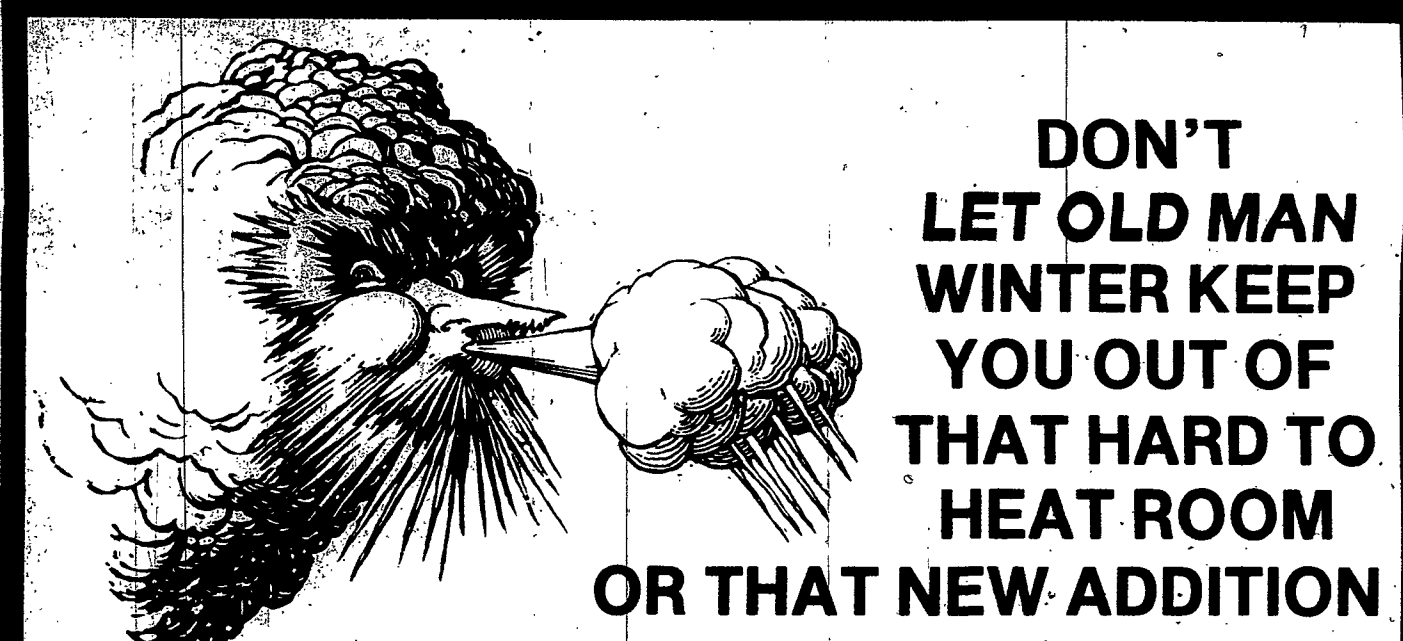
